Johnson have good and sufficient excuse for their nonattendance, It is ordered by the Court that they be, and are Excused. And the following of said persons so summoned to serve as Grand Jurors were then duly examined as to qualification by the Court and were then duly and legally empanelled, sworn and charged by the Court M. C. Kinniddie having been appointed and sworn by the Court as foreman of said Grand Jury: R. L. Guille Jr, Arrie Stapleton, J. L. Ferguson, Chas F. Swan, W. D. Cleverdon, L. C. McPherson, H. M. Gilly, H. C. Staples, E. M. Strong, J. B. Vaughn, Geo H. Hoyle

H. N. Hayes, J. H. Underwood, E. W. Matters and Joseph Menzies and the said Grand jury then returned under the charge of Walter H. Sibley who had been duly appointed and sworn by the Court as Bailiff to said Grand jury.

And the said Grand jury among other indictments returned the following:

The Grand Jury of said County charge that, before the finding of this indictment Charity Harris assaulted and beat Roland Rice.

And said Grand Jury further charge, that, before the finding of this indictment, Charity Harris assaulted Roland Rice by cutting him with a knife against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
