Humphries who compose the Grand Jury for this term, and it appearing to this Court, that the Grand Jury is now complete and is composed of the said eighteen named jurors, the Court appointed George W. Humphries, as foreman of the said Grand Jury, and administered to him the oath set forth in section 7284 of the Criminal Code of Alabama, while the oath set forth in section 7285 was duly administered to the other Grand Jurors, and M. H. Wilkins was sworn in as Bailiff in attendance to the Grand Jury, thus organized, who being duly charged in reference to the business to be transacted by them retired to the Grand Jury Room.
