And we, and each of us hereby waive all rights to claim of exemption we or either of us have now or may hereafter have under the Constitution and laws of Alabama, and we hereby severally certify that we have property free from all incumbrance to the full amount of the above bond. proof having been made to the satisfaction of the Court that J. G. Timney had a good and sufficient excuse for his non-attendance, it is ordered by the Court that he be and is excused, James P. Stapleton, Peter G. Dahl, Dan G. Perkins, Jerome Gray, and Joseph M. Gill, in open Court, submitted reasons why they should not serve as jurors at the present term of this Court, and asked the Court to excuse them, which upon consideration it is ordered by the Court that they be and are excused, James P. Stapleton being permanently excused. Thereupon after hearing all excuses and claims of exemption and disqualification and passing upon all of the excuses or claims, the Judge presiding in open Court caused the names of all the jurors in attendance upon the Court.
