To any Sheriff of the State of Alabama - Greeting It having been made known to the Court, by competent evidences that heretofore viz on the 21 day of April 1911 a subpoena issued out of this Court directed to Anna Williams commanding her to appear at the present term of this Court to give evidence in behalf of State in a case pending in this Court, wherein State of Alabama Plaintiff and Elm Asker Defendant and if appearing to the Court by return of Sheriff, on said subpoena endorsed that the said Annie Williams was duly summoned to appear at this term and from term to term thereafter, according to law,

Whereupon the Court required all of the said persons  
 summoned to be called, all of whom answered to their  
 names except: Stoney C Pussley, Thomas Hadley  
 & Hede Timney, Warren W Worcester, Frank J Scanlan,  
 and Arze Wix and proof having been made to  
 the satisfaction of the Court that J. Hede Timney  
 had a good and sufficient excuse for his non at-  
 tendance, it is ordered by the Court that he be and  
 is excused. James C Stapleton, Peter K Gahl,  
 Dan H Balkins, Jerome Seay, and Joseph McGill  
 in open Court, submitted reasons, why they should  
 not serve as jurors at the present term of this  
 Court, and asked the Court to excuse them, which  
 upon consideration it is ordered by the Court, that  
 they be and are excused. James C Stapleton,  
 being permanently excused. Thereupon after hear-  
 ing all excuses and claims of exemptions and  
 disqualifications, and passing upon all of the  
 excuses or claims, the Judge presiding in open  
 Court caused the names of all the jurors in  
 attendance upon the Court, who were not excused  
 by the Court to be written upon separate slips  
 or cards and placed in a hat or box, and there-  
 upon the Judge of the Court did in open Court  
 draw from the hat or box, the names of eighteen  
 jurors who were then duly and legally em-  
 panelled, sworn and charged by the Court as  
 the Grand Jury, for the present term of the  
 Court, as follows to wit: C Brad Dannelly,  
 having been appointed and sworn by the  
 Court as Foreman of said Grand Jury,  
 Joseph D Weeks, Thomas Mc Cornell,
