3. The Court charges the Jury that it is a Rule of the Road in Alabama that no person shall turn a vehicle to enter a private road or driveway, or otherwise turn a vehicle from a direct course or move right or left upon a roadway, unless and until such movement can be made with reasonable safety. If you are reasonably satisfied from the evidence in this case that Thomas J. McCabe, the driver of the automobile in which the plaintiff was riding at the time and place alleged in the complaint, made a left turn into a private driveway when such movement could not be made with reasonable safety, and that such action on the part of Thomas J. McCabe was the proximate cause of the plaintiff's injuries, your verdict should be for the defendant.

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2. I charge you, Gentlemen of the Jury, that the driver of a car, desiring to make a left-hand turn to enter a private road or drive-way, should exercise extra precaution before attempting the left turn in order to see that such turn can be made in safety, and if you are reasonably satisfied from the evidence in this case that Thomas J. McCabe, the driver of the automobile in which the plaintiff was riding, failed to exercise extra precaution in making the left turn and that this action on the part of the said driver, Thomas J. McCabe, was the proximate cause of the plaintiff's injuries, your verdict should be for the defendant.
