TO THE HONORABLE F.W. HARE, JUDGE OF SAID COURT, SITTING IN EQUITY.

Your Petitioners T.J. Klumpp and Minerva Klumpp, his wife, present this Bill of Complaint against J.L. Meek and R.C. Keeney and thereupon your Petitioners complain and show unto the court and your Honor as follows:

- (1) Your Petitioners are over twenty-one years of age and are residents of Baldwin County, Alabama and they bring this, their Bill of Complaint, against the Respondents, J.L. Meek and R.C. Keeney who are both over the age of twenty-one and reside in Baldwin County Alabama.
- (2) Your Petitioner shows unto your Honor that on the 10th day of July, 1940 Complainants entered into a purported real estate contract whereby they agreed to sell certain land in Baldwin County, Alabama to-wit:

All of Section 29, Township 5, South Range 3 East containing 640 acres more or less

to J.L. Meek in which transaction Mr. R.C. Keeney acted as broker. Your Petitioner received the sum of One Hundred and no/100 (\$100.00) Dollars on this purported contract and Respondents agreed that a decree to quiet the title to the land would be put through the Chancery Court and that on the date this decree was signed there should be due and payable to Complainants the sum of Six Hundred and Fiftytwo and 25/100 (\$652.25) Dollars.

Complainants aver that they have in all respects complied with their part of the purported contract but that on the 2nd day of December, 1940 the Honorable F.W. Hare rendered a final decree quieting the title to the aforesaid land and that there was then due the sum of money aforesaid.

Complainants aver that they have made numerous demands for the payment of this money and that it has not been forthcoming; that on the 4 th day of January, 1941, T.J. Klumpp and Minerva Klumpp filed a formal notification that they had elected to rescind the purported contract aforesaid for the reason that the sum of money set forth above had not been paid to them and they thereupon tendered a United States money order in the amount of One Hundred and no/100 (\$100.00) Dollars which was placed in a registered mail letter with return receipt requested, said payment thus coming into the hands of J.L. Meek on June 7, 1941.

Your Petitioners aver that Respondent J.L. Meek has since that time refused the One Hundred and no/100 (\$100.00) pollars tender of the original purchase price paid by him and has refused to treat the aforesaid purported contract as repudiated, at the same time refusing to make payment of the Six Hundred Fifty-two and 25/100 (\$652.25) Dollars which has been due since last December 2, 1940 and is still due and unpaid.

Petitioners aver that the numerous times and in numerous ways they have tried to get complainant to live up to his agreement, all of no avail.

Petitioner aver that on July 10, 1940 Respondent R.C. Keeney claimed a commission of Five Hundred Twelve and no/100 (\$512.00) Dollars being the amount of which they alleged was due them from the aforesaid purported sale of the land from the land referred to above and Complainants aver that no part of this commission has been earned.

Petitioners aver that they are now and have been since the 4th day of January, 1941 willing to return the initial One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars paid by Respondent J.L. Meek.

Complainants aver that they are ready, willing and able to restore the status quo as a condition precedent to the reliefsought in this Bill.

Petitioners aver that the repeated and continual refusal of Respondent J.L. Meek to perform his part of the aforesaid purported contract amounts to a substantial and material breach going to the essence of the contract.

Complainants aver tha Respondents R.C. Keeney and J.L. Meek misled and misrepresented their position, the financial ability of Respondents to comply with the conditions of the contract and that immediately upon learning of the pretended sale Complainants tendered back the money paid and gave notice that Complainants would not comply with the purported contract but would repudiate the same.

### PRAYER FOR PROCESS

Your Petitioners pray that the said J.L. Meek and said R.C. Keeney be made parties respondent to this Bill of Complaint and that the usual process of this Honorable Dourt to forthwith issue to them and to each of them.

### PRAYER FOR RELIEF

Your Petitioners further pray that upon final hearing of this cause, your Honor will grant and enter a decree for recision and direct the cancellation of a certain agreement dated July 10, 1940 and signed by T.J. Klumpp, Minerva Klumpp and J.L. Meek.

Petitioner further prays that your Honor will enter and grant a decree rescinding and directing the cancellation of an instrument dated July 10, 1940 and signed by T.J. Klumpp and R.C. Keeney relating to the commission claimed under the pretended sale aforesaid.

Your Petitioner furth prays that he be put into possession of the aforesaid land and that respondents be required to make payment for the turpentine taken from the land, for the timber, cut and removed thereform, for the rental value thereof and for any other waste committed upon the aforesaid land during the time it was in the possession of Respondents so that justice and equity may be done in restoring the Complainant to his status quo prior to the pretended contract of sale dated the 10th day of July, 1940 aforesaid.
