FINDINGS OF FACT AND LAW AND CONCLUSIONS

From the pleadings, testimony and other evidence in this cause, the Court finds as follows:

That on or about the 4th day of June, 1962, the plaintiff, Roland Parker Butts, suffered injuries as the direct and proximate result of an accident which occurred while he was in the employ of the defendant, Robertsdale Mill and Elevator Company; that said accident occurred on the premises of the Robertsdale Mill and Elevator Company in Baldwin County, Alabama; that at the time and place of said accident the plaintiff was working as a feed grinder when he tripped over a rope or cable and fell into a bin; that at the time and place of said accident the plaintiff was acting within the line and scope and in the course of his said employment by the defendant; that at said time both the plaintiff and the defendant were subject to Article 2 of the Alabama Workmen's Compensation Law; that said accident arose out of and in the course of the employment of the plaintiff by the defendant; that the plaintiff's average weekly wage for the fifty-two weeks immediately preceding the date of said accident was approximately \$50.00; that at the time of the occurrence of said accident the plaintiff was married and had two dependent children under the age of eighteen years; that the defendant received notice of the occurrence of said accident within the time prescribed by law; that as a direct and proximate result of said accident the plaintiff suffered injuries; that

a dispute exists between the plaintiff and the defendant as to whether or not the plaintiff's injuries are permanent, and further as to whether or not the plaintiff's injuries were suffered as the result of an accident which arose out of and in the course of his employment by the defendant, and whether or not such injuries are compensable under the Alabama Workmen's Compensation Law, but that the plaintiff is willing to accept, and the defendant, by and through its workmen's compensation insurance carrier, is willing to pay to the plaintiff the sum of \$1,000.00 as all compensation due the plaintiff for said injuries, including medical expenses and all expenses incurred by the plaintiff in and about the treatment of his said injuries; that the Court is of the opinion that a settlement of all compensation to which the plaintiff is entitled as a result of said accident for the said sum of \$1,0000.00 is for the best interest of the plaintiff and that said settlement should be, and the same hereby is, approved by the Court, and the Court is further of the opinion that it is to the best interest of the plaintiff that the said sum of \$1,000.00 be paid to him in one lump sum.

JUDGMENT

THE PREMISES CONSIDERED, IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COURT that the plaintiff is entitled to receive from the defendant the sum of One Thousand and No/100 (\$1,000.00) Dollars as payment in full of all compensation due the plaintiff by the defendant for all injuries received by the plaintiff as a result of said accident.

According to my diary, my Motion to Require Mr. Julius Childress to answer certain questions put to him by me at the taking of his deposition last August was set for hearing at Bay Minette at 10:00 A.M. on today, March 10th, 1964. Again let me say how sorry I am to have inconvenienced all of you and I hope that you will accept my apology.

That heretofore, and on, to-wit, the 23rd day of July, 1963, the Defendant filed in said cause a notice to the attorney for the Plaintiff in said cause of its intention to take the deposition of Julius Childress, a witness in said cause; that the Defendant requested that a subpoena be served upon the said Julius Childress notifying him to appear at the office of Defendant's attorneys in Mobile, Alabama on August 21, 1963, for the purpose of having his deposition taken by the Defendant; that said subpoena was served on said witness in due course; that said witness appeared at the appointed time and place for said deposition; that said deposition of said witness was taken on said date of August 21, 1963, in accordance with said notice; that at the taking of said deposition said witness refused to answer certain questions propounded to him upon oral examination, which questions pertained to a certain alleged altercation between said witness and the Plaintiff during the month of June, 1962 and that such questions, if well and truly answered, will be material evidence at the trial of this case.

That the original transcript of said deposition is filed herewith and made a part of this motion as though fully set out herein, and those questions referred to hereinabove appear on pages 5, 6, 7, 8, 10, 11 and 12 of said deposition.

WHEREFORE, under the provisions of Title 7, Section 474(17) of the Code of Alabama, the Defendant prays that this motion be heard by the Court after reasonable notice of same to the said Julius Childress, whose address is Robertsdale, Alabama, and to Honorable John V. Duck, attorney for Plaintiff, at his office in Fairhope, Alabama, and that upon such hearing the Court

will compel said witness to fully answer such questions.

AMENDED BILL OF COMPLAINT

Comes now the Plaintiff in the above styled cause, and amends the Bill of Complaint filed heretofore as follows:

The Plaintiff claims of the Defendant banefits under the workmens compensation laws of Alabama due and owing under the following statements of facts: That on or about the 4th day of June, 1962, the relation of employer and employee existed between the Defendant, Robertsdale Mill and Eleavator Company, a Corporation, and Plaintiff, Roland Parker Butts, and Plaintiff and said Defendant was subject to Workmens Compensation laws of Alabama, and while so employed and engaged in the business of the Defendant, and while acting in the line and scope of his employment with the said Defendant, the Plaintiff suffered an accident which arose out of and in the course of said employment. As a proximate result of said accident the Plaintiff suffered a severe injury to his head, a brain concussion. A controversy has arisen as to the benefits to be paid under Workmens Compensation.

Plaintiff further avers that at the time of said accident on or about the 4th day ofJune, 1962, Plaintiff was attempting to lift and carry a bag or sack of grain or feed and that he tripped and fell over a cable rope or wire and his head was thrown into an abutment or wall, and as a proximate result of which, Plaintiff suffered a severe concussion of the brain. Said accident occured in Baldwin County, State of Alabama.

Plaintiff further avers that the Defendant had prompt and immediate notice of the said accident, and that the Defendant

has failed, neglected or refused to pay any workmens compensation benefits by way of weekly compensation payments, hospital bills, drug bills, X-ray bills, doctors bills or otherwise.

Plaintiff alleges that at the time of his injury and for the prior 52 weeks thereto, his average weekly wages was the sum of, to-wit: Fifty Dollars (\$50.00).

plaintiff further alleges that at the time of the accident complained, and at the present time, he had a wife and two minor children, all of whom were and are his dependents.

Wherefore, Plaintiff claims of the Defendant such benefits as he is entitled to receive under the workmens Compensation Laws of Alabama.
