TO THE HONORABLE FRANCIS W. HARR JUDGE

SITTING IN EQUITY.

Now comes your complainant, Leona Parker Dean, humbly complaining of the defendant, George Thomas Dean, in a matter of divorce, as will hereinafter appear, and represents and shows unto Your Honor as follows:

FIRST: That both the complainant and the defendant are over the age of twenty one (21) years, and are both residents of Baldwin County, Alabama.

SECOND: That complainant and defendant were married to each other ~~other~~ on the 10th day of October 1936, in Baldwin County, Alabama, and lived together thereafter as man and wife until on ~~to-wit~~, the 20th day of February 1941.

THIRD: That there were born to the union of the complainant and the defendant two children, David Lee Dean, a boy now about four years of age and Carolyn Dean a girl now about five weeks old. That the complainant loves these children with the lasting love of a mother, and is a suitable person to have the care and custody of these children while the defendant, owing to the fact that he is dissolute, and lives a wild and profligate life is not a suitable person to be entrusted with the care and custody of the children, and that the children have been in the custody of the complainant ever since the separation.

FOURTH: That the defendant had for sometime prior to February 20th, 1941, been engaged in adulterous relations with one Mamie Hadley. That this conduct was not known to the complainant until the 20th day of February 1941, at which time, upon discovering his infidelity she ceased to live with him as his wife and has not returned to live with him as his wife, did not conive or collude with him in the commission of his fault, nor has she forgiven him for the same.

FIFTH: That the defendant is an able bodied man and is well able to provide for and maintain the complainant and the children born to the union. That he has a salary amounting to \$45.00 per month, owns real property worth appromixately \$400.00 and owns cattle and personalty worth appromixately \$400.00, while the complainant is sickly and is unable to maintain and provide for herself and her children.

P R A Y E R F O R P R O C E S S.

TO the end that equity may be had in the premises, the complainant prays that a summons will be issued and served upon the complainant, together with a copy of this Bill within the time, and under the penaltites prescribed by law and the rules of this Honorable Court.

P R A Y E R F O R R E L I E F.

Premises considered, the complainant prays that on a final hearing of this cause your Honor will make and enter a decree dissolving the bonds of matrimony heretofore existing between the complainant and the defendant and granting to the complainant the right ~~to~~ again marry should she so desire. The complainant prays that in and by virtue of the decree entered in this cause she will be granted the full and complete custody of the minor children David Lee Dean and Carolyn Dean. Complainant further prays that in and by virtue of said decree she will be given alimony payable to her in such sum and at such times as is ^{deemed} expedient by the Court.

Complainant prays all other and
further general relief to which she may be entitled, the
premises considered, and will ever pray, etc., etc..

He also avers that he has not been inducted into Military service and that he has received no questionnaire and is in no manner engaged in the military service of the United States. He requests that in the event a decree is granted in this cause he will, in and by virtue of the terms of the same be given the right to again marry should he so desire.



It is hereby agreed by and between Leona Dean and George Thomas Dean, subject to the approval of the Judge of the Twenty first Judicial Circuit of Alabama, that the care, custody and control of the minor children of said parties, namely, David Lee Dean, a boy, now about four years old, and Carolyn Dean, a girl, now about one month old, shall be and remain with their mother, the said Leona Dean. It is further agreed that the said George Thomas Dean shall have the right to visit the said children at all reasonable times and places.

And the said parties do further mutually agree that the said Leona Dean for the support of herself and the said minor children mentioned above shall be paid an amount, which under present conditions, has been agreed on between the parties, to be FIFTEEN DOLLARS (\$15.00) per month; said payments to begin at once and to continue until the said children have reached the age of eighteen years. Should the husband lose his job, or suffer a reduction in salary, or an increase in salary or income this amount shall be altered accordingly.

It is further agreed that this amount is to be paid to the said Leona Dean as and for alimony, maintenance or support and that in the decree which will be entered in this cause the Judge of the Twenty first Judicial Circuit is requested by each of the parties to order the sum paid as alimony by the said George Thomas Dean to the said Leona Dean.
