
PLEA

Now comes the defendant in the above styled cause and for plea to the complaint heretofore filed in said cause and to each count thereof, separately and severally, says, separately and severally:

1. The allegations of the complaint are untrue.

2. For further answer to the complaint and each count thereof and by way of set off and recoupment the defendant says that at the time this suit was commenced the plaintiff was indebted to him and the defendant claims of the plaintiff the sum of Fifteen Hundred Dollars (\$1500.00) damages for a breach of warranty in the sale of a horse by the plaintiff to the defendant on to-wit, the 21st day of July, 1965, which horse the plaintiff warranted to be a registered Appaloosas stallion suitable for stud, when in fact the said horse was a crypt orchid and sterile, wherefore, defendant offers to set off the amount due him from the plaintiff and claims damages for the excess.

For further answer to the complaint and by way of set off and recoupment the defendant says that the plaintiff was indebted to him on the date this suit was filed and the defendant claims of the plaintiff the sum of Five Hundred Forty-five Dollars (\$545.00) due from her for merchandise, goods and chattels sold by the defendant to the plaintiff on to-wit, the 21st day of July, 1965, which sum of money, with the interest thereon, is still unpaid.
