It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that neither party to this suit shall again marry except to each other until sixty days after the rendition of this decree, and that if appeal is taken within sixty days, neither party shall again marry except to each other during the pendency of said appeal.

It is further ordered that William Luther Gill. be, and he is. hereby permitted to again contract marriage upon the payment of the cost of this suit.

It is further ordered that William Luther Gill the Complainant. pay the cost herein to be taxed, for which execution may issue.

Should your Complainant be mistaken in the relief prayed for, that there be granted to him such other, different and general relief to which he may be entitled, and as in duty bound he will ever pray.
