JOE BROCK, BEING FIRST DULY SWORN, TESTIFIED:

Examination by Mr. Johnston.

Q. Are you Mr. Joe Brock?

A. I am.

Q. Are you the father of Jerry Brock?

A. Yes sir.

Q. How old is Jerry?

A 12.

Q. Was he infured in an automobile accident on or about January 11, 1957?

A. Yes sir.

Q. At that time was he on a school bus on the public highway in Baldwin County, Alabama?

A. Yes sir.

Q. Was that on U. S. Highway 90?

A. Yes sir.

Q. Approximately three miles north of Robertsedale?

A. I would say about a mile north of Robertsedale.

Q. Do you know ^{if} Mr. Luther G. Harding, the defendant in this case is the man that ran into him?

A. No sir I don't know that.

Q. You understand Mr. Brock, that the suit you filed was for \$100.00 for damages for your son, Jerry Brock?

A. Yes sir.q

Q. What damages did he suffer?

A. A cut on his eye and his lip and nose.

Q. What damages did he suffer according to Doctor B. H.

Boswell's report? -- Did you see that report?

A. No sir, I didn't see it.

(Mr. Johnston hands Mr. Brock Doctor Boswell's Report)

Q. Doctor Boswell stated he suffered a cut on his eye?

A. Yes sir and his lip and nose.

EXAMINATION BY JUDGE HALL:

Q. Mr. Brock, are you satisfied with the \$100.00 settlement?

A. Yes sir.

Q. That is final when the judgment is entered?

A. I know that.

Q. The boy has not suffered any since Jan ary?

A. No sir, he has been all right; he has had a little knee trouble, but we don't know whether that happened from the wreck or playing ball.

Q. (To Mrs. Brock, the mother of Jerry Brock) Mrs Brock, are you satisfied with the \$100.00 settlement?

A. Yes sir.

Q. You want to settle the case?

A. Yes sir.

Q. Jerry is all right now?

A. Yes sir, he complains a little with his knee which swells up and gets stiff, but we don't know whether he got that in the wreck or not? He might have got it playing ball.

Q. But you all are satisfied and want to settle the case?

A. Yes sir.
