I, R. S. Duck, Clerk of the Circuit Court, beg to report that the above-styled case, our No. 860, filed under the provisions of said act was disposed of on 28th day of August, 1942 by the following judgment:

This cause coming on to be heard upon the petition of Annie Dozier Allen on behalf of herself and her two minor children, Dozier and Marion Elizabeth Allen, and the reply to said petition, filed on behalf Hardaway Construction company a Corporation., and it appearing to the court, and the court Finding that due notice of this hearing has been given to all parties entitled to the same, and both parties being present before the court and represented by their respective counsel, and the court having heard the argument of counsel and being advised of its opinion in the premises,

It is therefore adjudged and decreed, that the court, has jurisdiction of the subject matter of the petition, and of the parties thereto, that it is advantageous and advisable that the prayer of the petition be granted, and the Hardaway Construction, a Corporation, by its insurance carrier Fidelity & Casualty Company of New York, be and it is hereby authorized and directed to make a lump sum payment to the said Annie Dozier Allen on behalf of herself and her two minor children towit Dozier Allen and Marion Elizabeth Allen, in the amount of \$5,400.00 Calculated on a six per cent basis of the present value of all installments due the said petitioner under the applicable provisions of law, which sum when received and accepted by the said Annie Dozier Allen, shall constitute payment in full of all liability and obligations owed to her by the respondent herein.

ANSWER AND CROSS BILL

Now comes the Respondent and for answer to the Bill of Complaint and for this her Cross Bill says:

1. She admits the allegations of paragraphs numbered 1 and 2 of the Bill of Complaint.
2. She denies the allegations of paragraph numbered 3 of the Bill of Complaint.
3. For further answer to the Bill of Complaint, Respondent alleges that she is the mother and the Complainant is the father of a girl child, Mary Annie Buck, who is under three years of age, who has at all times resided with the Respondent, who is a fit and proper person to have the care, custody and control of the said child, but who is in necessitous circumstances because of Complainant's failure to care for her and said child; that the Complainant is an able bodied man working regularly, earning approximately Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) per week and that it has been necessary that the Respondent employ an attorney or solicitor to represent her in this cause.
4. Respondent denies each and all of the allegations of the Bill of Complaint which have not been specifically answered herein.

PRAYER FOR PROCESS

Respondent prays that this Answer be taken and treated in all respects as a Cross Bill and that a summons be issued to the Complainant and Cross Respondent requiring him to appear and plead, answer or demur to this Cross Bill within the time required by law.

WE COMMAND YOU, That you summon ALMA BUCK to be and appear before the Judge of the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, exercising Chancery jurisdiction within thirty days after the service of summons, and there to answer, plead or demur, without oath, to a Bill of Complaint lately exhibited by DOWLING BUCK against said ALMA BUCK, and further to do and perform what said Judge shall order, and direct in that behalf, and this the Respondent shall in no wise omit, under penalty, etc. And we further command that you return this writ with your endorsement thereon, to our said Court immediately upon the execution thereof.

And now comes your Complainant, DOWLING BUCK, and humbly complaining against the Respondent, ALMA BUCK, respectfully represents and shows unto your Honor and this Honorable Court as follows:

1.

That the Complainant and the Respondent are both bona fide residents of Baldwin County, Alabama, and twenty years of age;

2.

That the Complainant and the Respondent were married at Bay Minette, Alabama, April 21, 1939, and lived together as husband and wife until about July 10, 1940;

3.

That on or about July 10, 1940, the Respondent voluntarily abandoned the bed and board of the Complainant, and has remained away voluntarily and continuously since that time.

PRAYER FOR PROCESS

Wherefore, the premises considered, your Complainant prays that your Honor will by proper process, make the said ALMA BUCK party respondent to this Bill of Complaint, requiring her to plead, answer or demur to the

same within the time and under the penalties prescribed by law and the practice of this Honorable Court.

Complainant further prays that upon a final hearing hereof, your Honor will give and grant unto him an absolute decree of divorce, forever barring the bonds of matrimony existing between him and the Respondent; and that your Honor will give and grant unto him such other, further, different and general relief as he may be in equity and good conscience entitled to receive, and as in duty bound he will ever pray.
