CIRCUIT COURT, Fall Term, 1922

The Grand Jury of said County charge that before the finding of this Indictment and subsequent to the 25th day of January, 1919, Homer Engin alias Homer Salter

did distill, make or manufacture alcoholic, spirituous, malted or mixed liquors or beverages a part of which was alcohol, contrary to law.

The Grand Jury of said County further charge that before the finding of this Indictment and subsequent to the 30th day of November, 1919, Homer Engin alias Homer Salter

did manufacture, sell, give away or have in possession a still, apparatus, appliance, or a device or substitute therefor, to be used for the purpose of manufacturing prohibited liquors or beverages contrary to law.

The Grand Jury of said County further charge that before the finding of this Indictment and subsequent to the 30th day of November, 1919, Homer Engin alias Homer Salter

did manufacture, sell give away or have in possession a still, apparatus, appliance or a device or substitute therefor, to-wit: A copper still, drum, pot, tub, can, barrel, pipe, trough, worm, condenser, capper, fermenter or flake stand to be used for the purpose of manufacturing prohibited liquors or beverages contrary to law; against the peace and dignity of the State of Alabama.
