Comes your petitioner, Earl Koch and shows unto this Court and unto your Honor as follows:-

FIRST:

That he is a minor over the age of eighteen years and a resident of 2425 A North 22nd St., Milwaukee, Wisconsin; that his father is dead and his mother is a non-resident of the State of Alabama; that said minor has no Guardian in the State of Alabama.

SECOND:

That your petitioner owns an undivided interest in certain real estate situated in Baldwin County, Alabama; that this interest is held as a tenant in common with several adults who have agreed to sell their interest in such property, but which sale has been delayed on account of the fact that your petitioner is a minor; that said property can not be sold without an expensive court proceeding, unless your petitioner is relieved of the disabilities of non-age, and for that reason it is to the best interest of your petitioner that he be relieved of such disabilities of non-age.

The premises considered, your petitioner prays that your Honor will cause a notice of the day set for hearing of this petition to be given by publication for three successive weeks in some newspaper published in Baldwin County, Alabama, and that on the day set for hearing such petition, that your Honor will make and enter a Decree relieving him of his disabilities of non-age and that such other proceedings be had and such other orders and decrees be made as may be necessary and proper in the premises to invest your petitioner with the right to sue and be

sued, to contract and be contracted with, to buy, sell and convey real estate and generally to do and perform all acts which he could lawfully do if he were twenty-one years of age. And your petitioner will ever pray.

TO THE HONORABLE F. W. HARE, JUDGE OF THE CIRCUIT COURT  
OF BALDWIN COUNTY, ALABAMA,  
AT LAW:

Now comes Jimmy Williams, who is of the age of eighteen years and a resident of said State and County, and respectfully alleges and represents unto your Honor and the Court as follows:

Heretofore on the 28th day of June, 1942, petitioner was, and had been for more than six months prior thereto, an employee of Bacon-McMillan Veneer Company, a Corporation, of Stockton in said State and County, and on said date while working as such employee petitioner was injured in that he lost the first phalanx of each of the following fingers, namely: his first finger or thumb, his second finger and his third finger. Petitioner's job was operating a veneer clipper and in some way his fingers were under the clipper and it caused said injury.

The said Bacon-McMillan Veneer Company carries its own insurance and has been paying to petitioner weekly compensation in the amount of \$7.15 each week. Petitioner is entitled to receive such compensation for a total of 62½ weeks.

Petitioner, on account of said injury, has been unable to work and earn any money, and has gone into debt, and further avers that he will be able to return to work within the next ten days. Petitioner also needs money to contribute to his father for his support as he is old and unable to work.

Petitioner has offered to accept a less sum than the total of the above payments and alleges that it is for the best interest of himself to accept a lesser sum. Petitioner avers that he is willing to and will accept the sum of \$275.00 in settlement of his claim against his said employer.

Wherefore, the premises considered petitioner prays that your Honor will approve such settlement and will make all such judgments and orders as may be necessary or proper in the premises.
