The Grand Jury of said county further charge that before the finding of this indictment Adam Frishkorn did operate or drive upon the public highway of Baldwin County, Alabama, to-wit: The Streets of Summerdale, a motor vehicle during the period from one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise without displaying at least two lighted lamps on the front and one on the rear and a red light visible from the rear of said motor vehicle.

The Grand Jury of said county further charge that before the finding of this indictment Adam Frishkorn did operate or drive a motor vehicle upon the public highways of Baldwin County, Alabama, at night without displaying lights as required by law.

The Grand Jury of said county further charge that before the finding of this indictment Adam Frishkorn did operate or drive a motor vehicle, to-wit: A Fordson Tractor, upon the Public Highway of Baldwin County, Alabama, to-wit: The Public Road leading from Summerdale to Foley, Alabama, during the period from one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise without displaying lights as required by law
