It is further ordered that the complainant pay the cost to be herein taxed, for which execution may issue.

TO THE HONORABLE F. W. HARE, JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Comes your complainant, Louis J. Cushion, who brings this his bill of complaint against the respondent, Pauline Lindsey Cushion, and alleges unto your Honor and the Court as follows:

1. He is a bona-fide resident of Baldwin County, Alabama, and has been such for more than one year next preceding the filing of this his bill of complaint. The respondent is now residing at Sanford in the State of Florida, is a non-resident of the State of Alabama, and her postoffice address is c/o A. E. Darlow, Sanford, Florida. Both complainant and respondent are over the age of twenty-one years.

2. Complainant and respondent were lawfully married to each other on the 14th day of February, 1942, by the County Judge of Bay County, Florida, and lived together as man and wife until the 15th day of February, 1942, on which said last date they separated for the reason and causes hereinafter set forth.

3. On said last date of February 15, 1942, the respondent committed adultery with a man whose name is unknown to complainant, and for that reason complainant ceased to live with respondent as man and wife and they have not lived together as man and wife or otherwise since said last date. Since said last date, the respondent has committed other acts of adultery with other men whose names are not now known to complainant.

WHEREFORE, the premises considered, complainant prays that the said Pauline Lindsey Cushion be made a party respondent to this his bill of complaint and that proper process forthwith issue to perfect service on her, the said Pauline Lindsey Cushion.

Complainant further prays that upon the final hearing hereof your Honor and the Court will be pleased to give and grant to him, the said Louis J. Cushion, a decree of absolute divorce from the said Pauline Lindsey Cushion, and will grant to complainant permission to again marry should he see fit so to do. And complainant further prays for such other, further and different relief, orders and decrees as he may be entitled to receive, the premises considered.

doth depose and say as follows:

My name is ~~Louis~~ Louis J. Cushion and I am the complainant in this cause for ~~divorce~~ divorce against the respondent, Pauline Lindsey Cushion. I am a bona fide resident of Baldwin County, Alabama, and have been such for more than one year next preceding the filing of my bill of complaint in this cause. I am over the age of twenty-one years. The respondent formerly resided at Iatham, Baldwin County, Alabama and ~~now~~ now resides at Sanford, Florida. She is a non-resident of the State of Alabama and is over the age of twenty-one years.

I and the said respondent were lawfully married to each other at Panama City, Bay County, Florida, by the County Judge of Bay County, Florida, on the 14th day of February, 1942.

We stayed together the one night of February 14, 1942, and separated at noon the next day, that is, we separated on the 15th day of February, 1942. I had us a room at one of the hotels in Panama City Florida, for the night of said February 14th, 1942, and without any warning, just before noon of the 15th of February, 1942, she told me she was tired of the place, called a taxi and left, as she said, to catch a bus and go home. I learned later that she went to meet a man named A. E. Darlow, of Sanford, Florida, and has not been home since except on one occasion. On this occasion, she went to her home in Iatham, Alabama, with this A. E. Darlow and introduced him around as her husband. They stayed together as man and wife at her mother's house for about a week. She is now living with A. E. Darlow, and has her home with him, in Sanford, Florida. I have not lived with her as man and wife or otherwise since our separation. The occasion that I referred to about her coming to her home was since February 15, 1942. I learned later that on the day she left me she went on home with this A. E. Darlow. I am and was at the time I married in the United States Army.

And the said J. C. McDonald doth depose and say as follows:

My name is J. C. McDonald. I live in Stockton, Baldwin County, Alabama, and am 44 years of age.

I know both parties to this suit and have known them for many years. During the month of June, 1942, I lived at Latham, Baldwin County, Alabama, within one hundred yards of the mother and father of the respondent. During June, 1942, the respondent, Pauline Lindsey Cushion, came to visit her parents and brought with her a man whom she introduced as her husband, his name being A. E. Darlow. She herself introduced him to me as such. I went to their home several times when they were visiting there and the whole family of the respondent spoke of the said Darlow as the husband of respondent. I know that they slept and stayed in the same bed in the same room together. This lasted fully a week. He was a strong, able-bodied man and nothing the matter with him from a physical standpoint. He appeared to be between thirty and thirty-five years of age and she was just above twenty-one.

I know the family of the complainant and know that he and the respondent have not lived together since they separated. He has been in the United States Army and she has been off down in Florida living with this Darlow.
