THE CONDITION OF THE ABOVE OBLIGATION IS SUCH, That, whereas, the above bounden

E. D. Brown was, on the 25th day of May, 1931, convicted in the Justice County Court of said County, of the offense of issuing a check without funds

and by the judgment of said Court sentenced to a fine of ten dollars and cost or 10 days in jail

And, whereas, the said E. D. Brown has this day prayed an appeal from said judgment to the Circuit Court of said County.

Now, if the said E. D. Brown shall appear at the next term of the Circuit Court, and from term to term thereafter until discharged, and abide by and perform whatever sentence may be adjudged in said Court against him, then the above obligation to be void; otherwise to remain in full force and effect; and each of us waive our exemptions as to personal property.
