- 7. Your Complainant avers and charges that the Respondent has committed actual violence upon the person of your Complainant, attended with danger to her life and health; that on or about January 28, 1948 the Respondent struck her several times and pulled out a great quantity of her hair.

Your Complainant further avers and alleges that the said Respondent has, since her said marriage with him, become addicted to habitual drunkenness, and that said habit continued to the date of separation as aforesaid; that during the said marriage she has suffered hardship and deprivation because of said habit and has earnestly tried to help Respondent cure it but is convinced it is impossible and that she cannot put up with it or live with him longer.
