witness named in the Requirement for Oral Examination, on the 15 day of October 1949, at the office of H. M. Hall

in Alabama, and having first sworn said Witness to speak the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth, the said Loula Roberts Wilson

doth depose and say as follows:

My name is Loula Roberts Wilson. I am over twenty-one years of age, and a bona fide resident of Baldwin County, Alabama. The Respondent Woodrow Wilson, is over twenty-one years of age, and a bona fide resident of Baldwin County, Alabama.

The Respondent and I married at Perdido, Alabama, on July 3rd, 1930. We lived together as husband and wife, in Baldwin County, Alabama, until on to-wit, October 1, 1949.

The Respondent for the past years has often threatened and abused me and threatened to do actual violence to my person which would necessarily endanger my life and health. This condition has grown worst from time to time, until now it is absolutely impossible for my to live with him. The conduct of the Respondent is such as to give me every reasonable apprehension to believe and I do actually believe that if I continued to live with him he will carry out his threats and do actual violence to my person which will necessarily endanger my life and health.

The Respondent and I have six children, three of whom are small and the other three are old enough and big enough to take care of themselves. The Respondent and I have agreed that I will have the custody, care and control of the three small children: Georgia Mae Wilson, age 8; Mary Lou Wilson, age 7, and Peggy Ann, age 4. I am fully capable, able and willing to care for these children.

I have for some time considered the matter of a separation and what was to the best interest of the children, and all parties involved and am now to the conclusion that it is to the best interest of all that the Respondent and I separate and secure a divorce.

Loula Roberts Wilson

Alex Walker, a witness for the Complainant, being first duly sworn, deposes and says: My name is Alex Walker. I live, and have lived for some time near, where Mrs. Loula Roberts Wilson and her husband live. I have on several occasions heard the complainant and the respondent fussing, and have on several occasions heard him threaten and abuse her. I have known the complainant and the respondent for some six years, and during the past year year, conditions have grown worst from time to time.

I have often heard them, and it is my opinion based upon my own personal knowledge and observation that the conduct of the respondent is such as to give the complainant every reason to believe that he will carry out his threats toward her and do her bodily harm.

October 1, 1949.



There was born to the marriage between your Complainant and the Respondent three children, Georgia Mae Wilson, age 8, Mary Lou Wilson, age 7, and Peggy Ann, age 4; that your Complainant is the suitable, fit and proper person to have their care, custody and control.

WHEREFORE the premises considered your Complainant prays that your Honor will, by proper process make the said Woodrow Wilson, party respondent to this bill of complaint, requiring him to plead, answer or demur to the same within the time and under the penalties prescribed by law, and the practice of this Honorable Court.

Complainant further prays that your Honor will upon a final hearing hereof, award to her a decree of divorce forever barring the bonds of matrimony existing between your Complainant and the Respondent; that she be awarded the custody, care and control of the minor children; Georgia Mae Wilson, age 8, Mary Lou Wilson, age 7, and Peggy Ann, age 4; that she be granted such other, further, difference or general relief as she may be in equity and good conscience entitled to receive.

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that neither party to this suit shall again marry except to each other until sixty days after the rendition of this decree, and that if appeal is taken within sixty days, neither party shall again marry except to each other during the pendency of said appeal.

It is further ordered that the Complainant and Respondent be, and they are hereby permitted to again contract marriage upon the payment of the cost of this suit.

It is further ordered that LOULA ROBERTS WILSON the Complainant pay the cost herein to be taxed, for which execution may issue.
