IN THE CIRCUIT COURT OF THE

TO THE HONORABLE TELFAIR J. MASEBURN, JR., JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Your Petitioner, the undersigned, CORA LAMBERT, respectfully shows unto your Honorable Court, and avers:

1. That she is over the age of twenty-one years, and is a resident of Baldwin County, Alabama.

2. That she is the mother of Gray Lambert, (Jr.), a minor over the age of eighteen years; that Gray Lambert, the father of said minor, Gray Lambert, (Jr.) is dead, and that the said minor has no legal guardian; and that said minor resides with your Petitioner in said County of Baldwin, State of Alabama, however, during the school year he attends school at the Baptist Theological Seminary, Chatanooga, Tennessee.

3. That the said Gray Lambert, (Jr.) is over the age of eighteen years, and will not attain the age of twenty-one years until July 23rd, 1950. That said minor owns property in the said County of Baldwin, Alabama, and is well educated for his years, is of sound mind and good judgment, has had some experience with business affairs, and is fully capable of transacting his business affairs, and that it will be to the best interest of said minor to be relieved of the disabilities of non-age.

Wherefore, your Petitioner respectfully prays this Honorable Court to set this petition down for a day to be heard, and will direct the issuance of notice to the said Gray Lambert, (Jr.) of the filing of this petition, and of the day set to hear and determine the same, in manner as provided by law; and that upon the hearing hereof may it please the court to make and enter a decree unconditionally relieving the said Gray Lambert (Jr.) of the disabilities of non-age; and that this Honorable Court make all such orders and decrees in the premises as to it may seem just and proper.
