PARISH of the disabilities of non-age; and that this Honorable Court make all such orders and decrees in the premises as to it may seem just and proper.

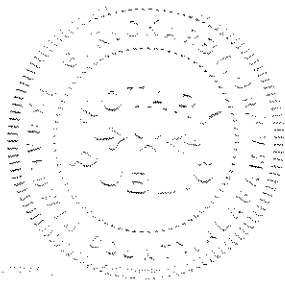





DECREE

This cause now coming on to be heard is submitted for final decree upon the petition, sheriff's return, note of submission, and affidavit, and upon consideration thereof the Court is of the opinion that all the allegations in the petition are true AND THAT said CHARLES W. PARISH is a minor over the age of eighteen years, and under the age of twenty-one years and he is a resident of Baldwin County AND THAT he is, for his age, a person of mature judgment and sober and industrious habits and is competent and capable in every way of handling his own affairs.

The Court further finds that it is to the interest of such minor to grant the prayer of this petition.

It is therefore ordered, ~~ad~~judged, and decreed by the Court that: The said CHARLES W. PARISH be and is hereby released from the disabilities of non-age and is now invested with the right to sue and be sued, contract, buy, sell and convey real estate and, in general, do and perform all acts which such minor could lawfully do if he were twenty-one years of age.

TWO: That the said ZELMA A. PARISH file a certified copy of this decree in the office of the Judge of Probate of Baldwin County, Alabama, and in each of the counties in which said minor hereafter shall reside and in the office of the Judge of Probate in each county in the state where said minor shall do any business or make any contract.

THREE: That the petitioners pay the cost of these proceedings to be taxed by the Register, for which execution may issue.
