Cramer, Attorney, in Fairhope, Alabama, and having first sworn said Witness es to speak the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth, the said Joseph J. Caproni doth depose and say as follows:

I am 25 years old and Eunice is 21. We were married October 10th 1949 in New York City. I am a horse trainer and, as such, I must travel a great deal. Eunice did not like the idea from the very start. About March 1st 1950, I took a position in Alabama. Eunice said she was not coming to Alabama with me. Instead, she elected to go to Seattle, Washington. Despite all of my efforts, she would not come to Fairhope after I came here to live. I have lived in Baldwin County since early in March, 1950, and she has not been with me since. I tried to reach her recently by a letter addressed to her by my attorney, Mr. Cramer, but the letter came back unclaimed. After I had started suit for divorce and Mr. Cramer had arranged for notice in the newspaper, she finally did write me saying that she hoped that I had gotten a divorce. Mr. Cramer sent the papers to the new address she gave me and, I understand, she signed them this time. She has written again since that time and it is plain to see that she had no intention of returning to me at any time since a year ago March. We have no children nor any property.
