STIPULATION

Wilson Hayes, having been duly and legally appointed to represent the said minor in this cause, acting thru themselves, and their respective attorneys of record, each acting with full authority, as follows:

1. That the petitioner is authorized to institute and prosecute this proceeding to acquire the property or interest for order of condemnation filed in the Probate Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, on the 12th day of August, 1966, for the public purposes stated in said application or petition.

2. That all proceedings in the Probate Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, in this cause were regular, and an appeal has been duly and properly perfected within the time allowed and entered in said Probate Court in this cause on the 12th day of October, 1966, to this Court and trial by jury on the issue of valuation has been properly demanded.

3. That the application or petition for order of condemantion correctly sets out the uses and purposes for which the property and rights herein sought is to be devoted, used or applied and the petitioner has the right to obtain said property in this proceeding for the purposes stated.

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4. That the respondents herein are the only parties known to either petitioner or respondents who have or asserts any right, title or interest in or to the lands or interest therein sought to be acquired.

5. That the respondents have had due notice of this trial and all proceedings herein and expressly enter their appearance in this Court, the minor, Melina L. Alford, entering her appearance thru Hon. Wilson Hayes, her duly appointed guardian ad litem.

6. That the only issue in this proceeding is the damages and compensation, if any, to which the respondents are entitled for the lands and interest in lands sought to be acquired by the petitioner for the uses and purposes stated.

7. That the time of taking in this proceeding is the date on which the application for order of condemnation was filed in the Probate Court, to-wit 12 August, 1966, and the valuation of said property was constant between that date and the date on which the order of condemnation was entered, to-wit, 21 September, 1966.

FINAL JUDGMENT

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This cause coming on to be heard by the Court on this the 7th day of <u>March</u>, 1967, now come the parties and their respective attorneys of record, and it appearing to the Court from the Stipulation of the parties made and entered into on this date and filed for record in this cause, that on the 12th day of August, 1966, an application was filed in the Probate Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, by the State of Alabama, seeking to condemn certain lands therein described for the uses and purposes therein averred, and that subsequent thereto proceedings were had in the Probate Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, and that the necessary action to properly effect the appeal from the Probate Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, in accordance with all the statutes and laws in such cases made and provided, to the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, were made, and that said Court did enter an order of condemnation of the lands described in said application and which are hereinafter described, and that on the 21st day of October, 1966, the Petitioner, State of Alabama, did appeal from said Order of Condemnation to this Court, and demanded a trial by jury; and it appearing to the Court, from the Stipulation of the parties hereinabove referred to, that the only issue in this proceeding is the damages and compensation, if any, to which the defendant landowners to-wit, Elma W. Alford, Barbara A. Bryant, and Melinda L. Alford, are entitled, and that an order of condemnation

to the lands hereinafter described should be entered for the uses and purposes set forth in the application, which is now on trial in this court.

And now comes a jury of twelve good and lawful men, to-wit, <u>Harry E. Crawford</u> and eleven others, and the issue of the amount of damages, and compensation, if any, to which the landowners are entitled having been submitted to them, did return a verdict in words and figures as follows, to-wit:

We, the Jury, find for the landowners and assess the damages and compensation at \$18,654.00.

And the Court having considered all of the above is of the opinion and judgment that an order of judgment of condemnation should be here entered conditioned upon the payment by the State of Alabama to the Clerk of this Court for the use and benefit of the Respondents, Alma W. Alford, Barbara A. Bryant, and Melinda L. Alford, a minor, the sum aforesaid, to-wit, <u>\$18,654.00</u>.

ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, as follows:

1. That the application of the State of Alabama for the condemnation of the lands, rights and construction hereinafter described be, and the same are hereby granted, and that the property described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, and by reference made a part thereof as though fully set forth herein, be, and the same is hereby condemned for the use by the State of Alabama as a right-ofway for a public road as set forth in the application aforesaid, and the rights therein are hereby divested out of the landowners and into the State of Alabama, upon the payment by the State of ALABAMA of the sum hereinafter ordered and decreed to be paid.

2. That the damages and compensation to which the Defendant landowners in this case, to-wit, Alma W. Alford, Barbara A. Bryant and Melinda L. Alford, a minor, are entitled is hereby fixed at

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the sum of <u>\$ 18,654.00</u>, which said sum is hereby ordered to be paid by the State of Alabama to the said Defendant landowners; and upon payment of said amount by the State of Alabama to said landowners the condemnation of the lands hereinabove described shall be, and become effective.

3. That the State of Alabama pay the costs of this proceeding. And the Court having heard oral testimony as to the amount of fee Wilson Hayes, Esquire, who was heretofore appointed as guardian ad litem for the one-fourth interest of the minor defendant landowner, to-wit, Melinda L. Alford, was entitled to, hereby fixes his said fee at \$300.00, which shall be paid by the Petitioner into the Court as an item of the cost of court in this proceeding. 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EXHIBIT "A"

As shown on the right-of-way map of Project No. S-60-E as recorded in the Office of the Judge of Probate of Baldwin County:
