I am asking for this divorce on the grounds of my husband's unfaithfulness of which I am assured but do not know of my own knowledge any of the details of this. But I know enough to make me determined to leave him and that is why I am seeking this divorce.

WOODIE SANDERS.

I am a resident of Baldwin County, living in Fairhope and am well acquainted with James Pierce. I know of my personal knowledge that he has been committing adultery with a woman here in Fairhope. The reason I know this is that several times in the last few weeks he and I have met by appointment a couple of girls of loose character and gone off in the woods with them at night. We would meet these girls on the outskirts of town and go off to some quiet place where we would separate and each couple go off apart from the other and do what we went there to do. Of course I did not see James in the act, I would have other things to do, but in a little while we would get back together and I would know from the way they both talked that they had been enjoying themselves in a way that he did not want his wife to know. I know what I wanted my girl to do and I know he expected the same of his and that he was not disappointed. I cannot now recall just the exact dates when this occurred but it has been several times since the first of this month of December. The place was in a place grown up with underbrush in the outer part of town

James wife left him a short while before Christmas and has not been back to him since. She suspected him of being intimate with some other woman and when she felt sure of this she left him though I do not think she knows anything but what she suspects. But it is a fact that he has had intercourse with another woman and that in the last few weeks.

THE PREMISES CONSIDERED, Complainant prays that James Leon Pierce be made party defendant to this bill and by proper process required to answer same within the time prescribed by law.

COMPLAINANT FURTHER PRAYS that upon the hearing of this cause a decree be rendered forever divorcing her from said James L. Pierce, granting her the right to matty again should she so desire and to such other, further or different relief as to equity may seem meet.
