It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that neither party to this suit shall again marry except to each other until sixty days after the rendition of this decree, and that if appeal is taken within sixty days, neither party shall again marry except to each other during the pendency of said appeal.

It is further ordered that WINNIE L CANNON. AND OLIVER. W CANNON. be, and they are hereby permitted to again contract marriage upon the payment of the cost of this suit.

It is further ordered that Winnie L Cannon. the Complainant pay the cost herein to be taxed, for which execution may issue.

TO THE HONORABLE F. W. HARE, JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Your complainant, Winnie L. Cannon, brings this her bill of complaint against the respondent, Oliver W. Cannon, and respectfully alleges and represents unto your Honor and the Court as follows:

1. Complainant is over the age of eighteen years and is now, and has been for more than one year next preceding the filing of this bill of complaint, a bona fide resident of Baldwin County, Alabama. The respondent is a resident of Baldwin County, Alabama, and is over the age of twenty-one years.
2. Complainant and respondent were lawfully married to each other of April 17, 1943, by the Probate Judge at Greenville, Alabama, and lived together as man and wife until the 25th day of May, 1943, and have not lived together as man and wife or otherwise since said date of May 25, 1943.
3. On said last date of May 25, 1943, complainant reasonably apprehended actual violence by respondent on her person, attended with danger to her life or health, from the conduct of respondent. Respondent threatened, neglected and abused complainant to such extent after marriage that she was in a highly nervous state and her health badly impaired, and she feared for her safety or health from the conduct of respondent.
4. Complainant's maiden name was Winnie Green Lambert.

WHEREFORE, the premises considered, complainant prays that the said Oliver W. Cannon be made party respondent to this her bill of complaint and that due process of law forthwith issue for service upon him, the said Oliver W. Cannon.

And complainant further prays that upon the final hearing hereof your Honor and the Court will be pleased to give and grant to her a decree of absolute divorce from the said Oliver W. Cannon, and will restore to her her maiden name of Winnie Green Lambert, and will give and grant to complainant permission to again marry, should she see fit so to do. And complainant further prays for such other, further and different relief as she may be entitled to receive, the premises considered.

_____ doth depose and say as follows:

My name is Winnie L. Cannon. I am the complainant in this cause for divorce against my husband, Oliver W. Cannon. I am over the age of eighteen years and have been a bona fide resident of the State of Alabama, and Baldwin County therein, for more than one year next preceding the filing of my bill of complaint in this cause. The respondent, Oliver W. Cannon, is also a resident of Baldwin County, Alabama, and is over the age of twenty-one years. I and the said Oliver W. Cannon were lawfully married to each other on the date of April 17, 1943, by the Judge of Probate at Greenville, Alabama, and lived together as man and wife until May 25, 1943, and we have not lived together as man and wife or otherwise since said last date.

On said last date of May 25, 1943, complainant reasonably apprehended actual violence by respondent on her person attended with danger to her life or health, there being reasonable apprehension of such actual violence ~~attended~~ on her person by respondent attended with danger to her life or health. After we were married I found out that my husband drank intoxicating liquors to excess and went out with other men with other women. Several times he stayed out all night and would get mad when I asked for an explanation. On this last date above he came home drunk and I could not stand his conduct and threats any longer as it all had my nervous system in a seriously rundown condition. So, for the safety of my health, I had to return to my parents to live. He would not give me any money to live on before or after our separation as stated, so I got a job and have taken care of myself since. So from his conduct I state that I reasonably apprehended actual violence on my person which was attended with danger to my health. I would like to have my maiden name of Winnie Green Lambert restored.

Winnie V. Lambert, being first by me duly sworn, deposes and says, as a witness in behalf of complainant, as follows:

My name is Winnie V. Lambert. I am a resident of Bay Minette, Baldwin County, Alabama, and am the mother of the complainant in this cause. I have read over the testimony of complainant and know that it is substantially true. I remember when they were married in April of 1943 and when they separated in May 1943.

I do not know all of the details of their disagreements but I know that he treated her shamefully and with neglect. Before she went to living with us again on May 25, 1943, she had gotten in a highly nervous state and rundown condition and if she had continued to live on as they were I am convinced that he would have done her serious harm while he was drinking, which we found after her marriage that he did to excess, and I know that her health would have been completely gone.


