It is further ordered that Annie Mae Brack the Complainant pay the cost herein to be taxed, for which execution may issue.

My name is Annie Mae Brack. I am over twenty-one years of age and am now a resident of Foley, Alabama, and I have been a bona fide resident of Alabama all of my life. Lynn R. Brack is over the age of twenty-one years of age and is a resident of Baldwin County, Ala. I and Lynn R. Brack was legally married at Tampa, Florida, November 22, 1950. We do not have any children.

Shortly after our marriage we established an upholstery business in Foley with money that I had earned. Lynn never took a proper interest in the business and I did most of the work of operating the place. Lynn got in the habit of whenever he left the shop to go after something or deliver something, of stopping by someplace where he could get a drink of beer or whiskey. As time went by he became steadily worse and the last year or so he began going out nearly every night and getting drunk and writing checks on the business until I changed our bank account, however this didn't stop him from writing checks and I paid most of his bad checks off. I finally had to go to all the beer joints and tell them that I would not pay any more of Lynn's bad checks. He managed to get money by one means or another to buy his drinks with and he has become addicted to habitual drunkenness which has continued to the time of filing this bill for divorce. He has also committed adultery with different persons whose names are unknown to me.

My name is Melba L. Lovell. I am over twenty-one years of age. I am Annie Mae Brack's sister. For the last year or longer, Lynn R. Brack has been addicted to habitual drunkenness. He spends all of his time and money getting drinks.

Your Complainant Annie Mae Brack respectfully represents and
shows unto your Honor:

1. That your complainant is over the age of twenty-one years
and is a resident of said State and County, and has been a bona
fide resident of said State for more than one year next preceding
the filing of this bill of complaint; Lynn R. Brack is over the age
of twenty-one years and is a resident of Baldwin County, Alabama.

2. That your complainant and respondent were lawfully married
on or about to-wit: November 22, 1950 at Tampa, Florida, and that of
this marriage there are no children.

3. Your Complainant further avers and alleges that said res-
pondent has been guilty of adultery with divers parties and persons
unknown to your complainant by name.

4. Your complainant further avers and alleges that the said re-
spondent has, since her said marriage with him, become addicted to
habitual drunkenness, and that said habit has continued to the filing
of this bill.

5. Your complainant further alleges and avers that on or about
to-wit: the first day of July, 1952, the complainant and respondent
established a business in Foley, Alabama, known as Lynn's Upholstery
Shop with money that was taken from the separate earnings of your com-
plainant. The complainant further alleges that said business was est-
ablished and conducted primarily through her efforts and labor and
the successful conduct of said business has been solely dependant upon
the efforts and labor of your complainant.

6. Your complainant further alleges that the respondent has
destroyed by burning and breaking, numerous possessions and property
of the business and of the complainants on numerous occasions; that
the respondent has spent large sums of money on drunken sprees giving
bad checks for which the complainant has personally made good; that
the respondent has forged the complainants name to checks and given
the same in payment for intoxicating drinks; That the Respondent has
committed waste of the business property and interefered with the con-
duct of the business to the extent of endangering the continued oper-
ation of said business; that the respondent took the pickup truck used
and very necessary to the business and drove to Tampa, Florida in it
against the wishes and without the knowledge of the complainant.

7. Your complainant further alleges that the respondent when
sober is a very capable person with a better than average knowledge
of several trades and is capable of earnings as high as \$150.00 per
week.

The premises considered, your complainant makes the said Lynn
R. Brack a party respondent to this bill of complaint and in order that
the complainant may have the relief herein prayed for may it please
your Honor to cause the States Writ of Subpoena to be issued, directed
to the said Lynn R. Brack, commanding him to answer, plead or demur
within the time required by law; Complainant prays that Your Honor

will grant to the complainant an injunction pendente lite without a hearing, enjoining the respondent from entering upon the premises of the business or the home of the complainant and in anyway committing waste or interfering with the conduct and operation and good will of the business or interfering or molesting the person of the complainant; that upon a hearing the injunction will be made permanent; and that upon a final hearing of this cause that your Honor will enter a decree divorcing your complainant from the respondent; granting the complainant the right to resume her maiden name, Annie Mae Wallace and ordering the respondent to pay the costs of this suit; the complainant's Attorney a reasonable fee and alimony to the complainant in the sum of \$50.00 per week; and that your Honor will grant to your complainant such other, further or different relief as unto your Honor may seem meet and proper and your complainant will ever pray.


