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and by reason thereof and as a proximate result and consequence of said negligence of the said Claude Pettus, the said Bobbie Mae Joiner, the plaintiff's intestate, was killed. The plaintiff further avers that the intestate's automobile was totally destroyed with other personal property; that there was ambulance fees, wrecker fees and funeral expenses incurred; the plaintiff further alleges that the intestate left surviving her one minor child, Alfred Joiner, a son fourteen years of age who resided with her and who was totally dependant upon the plaintiff's intestate for his support and maintenance and that this action is brought for the benefit of said child and estate.

All of the above damages outlined in this count are the proximate result and consequence of the negligence aforesaid of the said Claude Pettus, Hence this suit.

COUNT TWO

The Plaintiff, LUTHER D. JOINTER, as Administrator of the Estate of Bobbie Mae Joiner, Deceased, claims of the Defendants, CLAUDE PETTUS, Alias JOHN DOE, and individual and Graham Oil Company, Incomporated, a Corporation, whose true name or names of the defendants are otherwise unknown to the plaintiff and and will be disclosed by amendment when ascertained, jointly and severally, the sum of \$40,000.00 as damages, for that he avers that on to-wit: May 13, 1967 at to-wit: 6:35 A.M., CLAUDE PETTUS, the agent, servant or employee of Graham Oil Company, Inc. in charge or control of the operation of a tractor-trailer oil truck on Alabama State Highway Number 59 at its intersection with Baldwin County road Number 36 in Baldwin County, Alabama, while acting within the line and scope of his employment as such agent, servant or employee, so wantonly operated said tractor-trailer oil truck that he caused it to collide with an automobile in which the plaintiff's intestate was riding at said time and place and as a result and consequence of the wanton misconduct of the Defendant Claude Pettus, the said Bobbie Mae Joiner, the Plaintiffs intestate was killed.
