"FOR" TAX REFORM——The Tax Reform Bill as finally approved by Congress is a far-reaching bill that affords tax relief mainly to taxpayers making \$20,000 per year and below. It removes more than 5,000,000 taxpayers from the income tax rolls by providing for a low income deduction of \$1,100 to go with the personal exemptions. Thus, a family of four, having four \$600 exemptions and a low income allowance, would pay no tax on the first \$3.500 of income. The surtax was reduced to 5 per cent starting January I and will expire July 1, 1970. Exemptions are to be gradually raised to \$750 each. The bill will bring in some \$6 billion in revenue on income not now being taxed.

This new law goes a long way toward equalizing the tax load of all the people. I was pleased to support the Tax Reform Legislation.


