



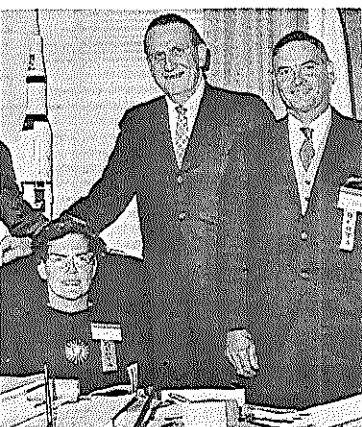

"AGAINST" EXTENDING VOTING RIGHTS

ACT--More next month about this, but I oppose extending the Act whether it is applicable in the South only or throughout the country. It will come up in the Senate on March 1st, according to present plans. You can count on extensive debate on this issue in the Senate.

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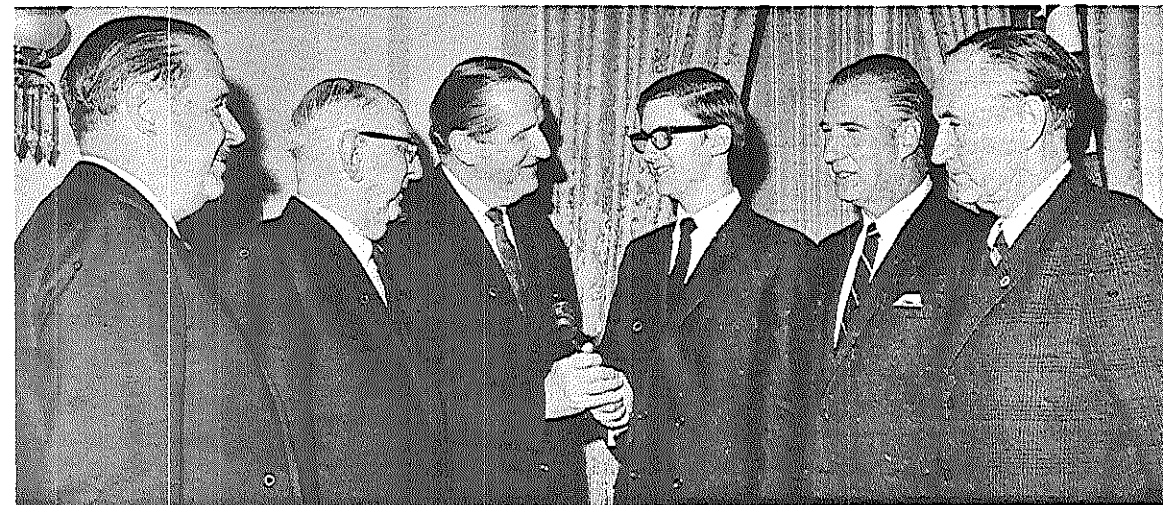
"FOR" TAX REFORM--The Tax Reform Bill as finally approved by Congress is a far-reaching bill that affords tax relief mainly to taxpayers making \$20,000 per year and below. It removes more than 5,000,000 taxpayers from the income tax rolls by providing for a low income deduction of \$1,100 to go with the personal exemptions. Thus, a family of four, having four \$600 exemptions and a low income allowance, would pay no tax on the first \$3,500 of income. The surtax was reduced to 5 per cent starting January 1 and will expire July 1, 1970. Exemptions are to be gradually raised to \$750 each. The bill will bring in some \$6 billion in revenue on income not now being taxed.

This new law goes a long way toward equalizing the tax load of all the people. I was pleased to support the Tax Reform Legislation.

Alabama was admitted to the Union on December 14, 1819, with Huntsville as the temporary Capital. One hundred fifty years later, on December 14, 1969, at the Madison County Courthouse in Huntsville a final program, sponsored by the Madison County Historical Society, was held, commemorating this memorable event. It was a privilege for me to speak at this ceremony and pay tribute to Alabama and to the men and women who have made of our State the greatest State in the Union. 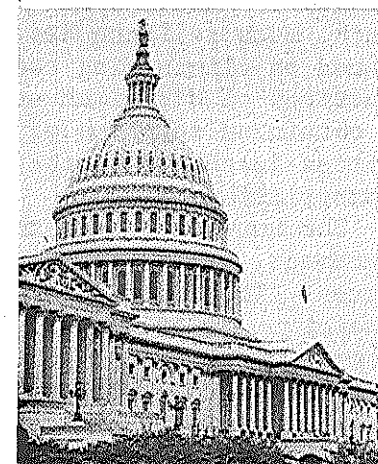


1. As to Count 1, not guilty.
