TO THE HONORABLE H. M. HALL, JUDGE OF THE CIRCUIT COURT:

Your complainant, EUNICE D. GUNNISON, REPRESENTS AND SHOWS to your HONOR as follows:

1. That she is over the age of twenty-one years of age and a bona fide resident of Baldwin County, Alabama and has been such for three years next preceding the filing of this her bill of complaint and the respondent, HAROLD C. GUNNISON, is a bona fide resident of Baldwin County, Alabama and over the age of twenty-one years.

2. That the complainant and respondent were lawfully married in Lucedale, Mississippi on to-wit the 30th day of August, 1954 and lived together as husband and wife until about October 1954.

3. That the respondent committed actual violence upon the person of his wife with intended danger to her life and health by striking her with his fist at their home outside of Fairhope, Ala. on or about the first part of October.
