It is further ordered that the Complainant and Respondent be, and they are hereby permitted to again contract marriage upon payment of the cost of this suit.

in Bay Minette, Alabama, and having first sworn said Witness ^{es} to speak the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth, the said Annie Pearl Crutchfield Wilson And Edna Lee Crutchfield doth depose and say as follows:

That my name is Annie Pearl Crutchfield Wilson, I am over the age of 19 and a resident of Baldwin County, Alabama and have been all my life. The Respondent L. T. Wilson is over the age of 21 and has been a resident of Baldwin County, Alabama all his life. We were married in Lucedale Mississippi on March 15, 1955 and lived together as husband and wife until our separation on or about the 27th of June, 1955. On that date and on several occasions prior thereto the respondent had threatened and abused me and doing actual violence to me but on the date of the separation he beat and abused me striking me about the head and leaving my left eye black, and blue marks on my neck. Having bruised me so that as to cause me to believe and I do believe that I am in fear of my life or health. Your complainant and the respondent have not lived together as husband and wife since that date. There are no children as fruits of this marriage and no property to be divided. Your complainant does not believe she will live together again with the respondent as his wife. She respectfully ask that she be allowed to resume the use of her maiden name, Annie Pearl Crutchfield.

Annie Pearl Crutchfield Wilson

That my name is Edna Lee Crutchfield, I know both parties to this cause. The Complainant is over the age of 19 and the respondent is over the age of 21 and both have been residents of Baldwin County, Alabama since birth. They were married in Lucedale, Mississippi on March 15, 1955 and lived together as husband and wife in Baldwin County, Alabama until June 27, 1955 when the respondent L. T. Wilson beat and abused the complainant Annie Pearl Crutchfield Wilson leaving black and blue marks about her face and neck so that she came in fear of her life and health. There are no children as fruits of this marriage and no property to be divided. I do not believe they will ever live together again as husband and wife.

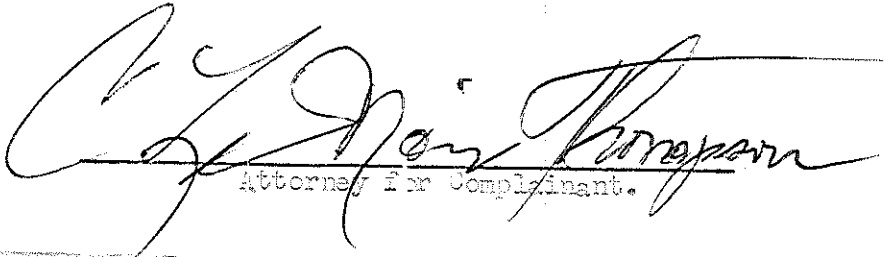
3.

WHEREFORE, the premises considered, the complainant prays that your Honor will by proper process make the said L. T. Wilson party respondent to this cause of action, requiring him to plead, answer or demur to the same within the time and under the penalties prescribed by law and the practice of this Honorable Court.

Complainant further prays that your Honor will upon a final hearing hereof award to her a decree of divorce forever barring the bonds of matrimony existing between your complainant and the respondent, and that she be granted such other, further, different or general relief as she may be in equity and good conscience entitled to receive.
