This cause coming on to be heard was submitted upon Bill of Complaint, ~~Decree Pro Confesso~~ on Answer and Waiver and Testimony as noted by the Register, and upon consideration thereof, the Court is of the opinion that the Complainant is entitled to the relief prayed for in said bill.

It is further ordered that the Complainant and Respondent be, and they are hereby permitted to again contract marriage upon the payment of the cost of this suit.

It is further ordered that James T. Allums the Complainant pay the cost herein to be taxed, for which execution may issue.





My name is JAMES T. ALLUMS and I am filing suit for divorce against my wife, JOHNNIE LAVERNE ALLUMS. We were married on June 11, 1950, and in October, 1950, I left for camp. Before I left for camp we were living here in Fairhope and had bought a place and I thought we were happily married. I have been stationed at Camp Rucker, Alabama, and have come home on passes about once every two weeks.

After I had been away for a while I noticed my wife started drinking regularly, which she had not done when we were first married. I cautioned her several times about drinking heavily but she persisted in doing it and has gotten drunk and passed out on several occasions and about every day she insists on drinking, and conditions being as they are, we cannot live together happily.

We have divided up our property and I have deeded her the home and all the furniture and she is making no claim for alimony.

I am a bona fide resident of Fairhope and have been living here six years and she came here about 18 months ago and is now living here in Fairhope. Both of us are over the age of twenty-one years.



TO THE HONORABLE TELFAIR J. MASHBURN, JUDGE OF THE CIRCUIT COURT
OF BALDWIN COUNTY, ALABAMA; IN EQUITY.

Comes JAMES T. ALLUMS, and by this his Bill of Complaint,
presented against JOHNNIE Laverne ALLUMS, respectfully shows:

FIRST: That complainant and defendant are both over the age
of twenty-one years; that both are now and have been for five
years, next preceeding the filing of this Bill of Complaint, bona
fide residents of the State of Alabama, and complainant has been
a bona fide resident of Baldwin County for over three years, next
preceeding the filing of this bill, and respondent has been a bona
fide resident of Baldwin County for over eighteen months, next pre-
ceeding the filing of this bill.

SECOND: That complainant and defendant were married in
Mississippi on the 11th day of June, 1950, and lived together in
Fairhope until he left for the army in October, 1950, and the com-
plainant came to Fairhope to see his wife approximately every two
weeks on passes and that to this marriage no children have been
born.


THIRD: That after their marriage the defendant became ad-
dicted to habitual drunkenness, which condition has gone from bad
to worse until the present time when complainant came home and
realized her condition, and since August 3rd, 1951, they have
lived separate and apart.

Complainant also shows that while living in Fairhope they
purchased a home in their joint names and that they have divided
up their personal effects in a manner satisfactory to both parties
and he has deeded to her his interest in their home and all their
furniture, in lieu of all alimony.

THE PREMISES CONSIDERED, complainant prays the JOHNNIE
Laverne ALLUMS be made party defendant to this cause, and by proper
process required to answer this Bill within the time prescribed by
law.

Complainant further prays that upon the hearing of this cause
a decree be rendered forever divorcing him from said JOHNNIE Laverne
ALLUMS, granting them both the right to marry again should they so
desire, and authorizing defendant to resume her former name.
