To The Honorable A. E. Gamble, Judge:

Humblly complaining, Your Orator Steve Williams, brings this hise Bill of Complaint against Minnie Williams, and respectfully represents unto Your Honor:

FIRST. Complainant is over the age of 21 years and resides in Baldwin County Alabama and has resided there for more than five years last past; That the respondent Minnie Williams is over the age of 21 years and Complainant is informed and believes she resides somewhere in the State of Louisiana, her exact place of residence being to Complainant unknown, but she is now in Mobile Alabama temporarily.

SECOND. Complainant and said Minnie Williams were married to each other in Baldwin County, Alabama, about 10 years ago and lived together for many years as man and wife, but have not lived together for more than two years last past for the reasons stated in paragraph THIRD hereof.

THIRD. That something over two years ago the said Minnie Williams committed adultery with a man named Nathan Crandall, and complainant charges her with adultery, and alleges that since he discovered her said infidelity he has not lived with her or in any way condoned the offense.

PRAYER FOR PROCESS.

THE PREMISES CONSIDERED, Complainant prays that Your Honor will take jurisdiction of the Cause made by this Bill of Complaint, and that by the proper process to issue from this Honorable Court, she, ^{Minnie Williams} be made a party Respondent hereto and be required to answer the charge herein made against her, in all things as required by the rules and practice of this Court.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF.


