~~This Court reserves control of this case for such further orders as from time to time shall seem to the interest of the children of the marriage.~~

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that neither party to this suit shall again marry except to each other until sixty days after the rendition of this decree, and that if appeal is taken within sixty days, neither party shall again marry except to each other during the pendency of said appeal.

It is further ordered that the Complainant and Respondent be, and they are hereby permitted to again contract marriage upon the payment of the cost of this suit.

It is further ordered that ED JACKSON, the Complainant pay the cost herein to be taxed, for which execution may issue.

CIRCUIT COURT OF BALDWIN COUNTY, ALABAMA: IN EQUITY.

Comes ED JACKSON, and by this his Bill of Complaint
presented against CLAUDIA JACKSON, respectfully shows:

FIRST: That Complainant and Defendant are both over
the age of twenty-one years; that both are now and have been for
more than five years next preceding the filing of this Bill of
Complaint bona fide resident citizens of Baldwin County, Alabama.

SECOND: That Complainant and Defendant were
married at Jackson, Alabama, on March 7th, 1931, but later moved
to Fairhope, Alabama, where they lived together as husband and
wife until June, 1943, when Defendant left Complainant and they
have since lived separate and apart.

THIRD: That to this marriage were born eight
children; Adeline Jackson, aged seventeen, Freddie Lee, 16;
John Lee, 12; Andrew, 10; Annie B., 9; Henry, 8; Bill, 7; Robert,
6.

FOURTH: That in June, 1943, Defendant left Complainant
of her own accord and they have since lived separate and apart; that
at the time Defendant left Complainant she took the children with
her and, though he has endeavored to get her to come back to him,
she would not do so and that said separation has continued without
resumption of marital relations up to the present time.

FIFTH: That Complainant has done nothing for her,
since she abandoned him and refused to return,
but has regularly contributed to the support of the children and
expects to continue to do so.

THE PREMISES CONSIDERED, Complainant prays that
Claudia Jackson be made party defendant to this cause, and by
proper process required to answer this Bill within the time prescribed
by law.

Complainant further prays that upon the hearing of this cause a decree be rendered forever divorcing him from the said Claudia Jackson, granting him the right to marry again should he so desire, and to have such other further or different relief as to equity may seem meet.

I am a resident citizen of Barnwell, Alabama and live about eight miles southeast of Fairhope. On March 7th, 1931 I married Claudia Sewell in Jackson, Alabama, and we later moved to Baldwin County in 1936 and have lived there together as husband and wife up to June, 1943, when my wife, who is also a resident citizen of Baldwin County since 1936, left me of her own accord and has not returned to my bed and board, though I have made a number of efforts to get her to come back. We now live about four miles apart and, while I have seen her frequently, we have had no marital relations since we parted in 1943. We have had eight children by this marriage, all of whom are living with their mother. My wife has completely abandoned my bed and board of her own accord for more than five years prior to this date.
