TESTIMONY OF IDUMA LEE MORRIS:

My name is Iduma Lee Morris; I am over the age of twenty-one years and a resident of Bon Secour, Baldwin County, Alabama, having been a bona fide resident for over one year; I was married to R. C. Morris on the 27th day of March, 1947; In the last of October of 1948 my husband left our home and went to Memphis, Tennessee, and told me that he was going after Flossie Mae Kelch, and told me that he was going to bring her back and his baby which had been born to them. He also told me that I might as well leave, that he was going to live with her. About two days later he came back with her and the baby and registered in a tourist camp. I found out about him being back and where he had taken her and went to the tourist camp and found that he had registered for them as husband and wife. This was on Sunday night. I left our home on Monday morning and went to my Aunt's home. On Wednesday following, this being about the 28th day of November, 1948, I went back to my house at about 6 o'clock in the evening. My husband and this woman were moving my furniture out of the house into another house and were moving her things into my house. I went back to my home. We got there about 11 o'clock at night. I knocked on the door and called my husband. When I called he turned on the light in the bedroom and all the shades were up and my brother and I could see clearly. He and this woman were in bed together. He ask me what I wanted and 1 told him that I wanted my clothes which were still in the house since that time, nor have I gotten my clothes, nor have I lived with my husband since the l8th of November, 1948, this being the time that he first brought this woman to the house. I believe that my husband and this woman, and this baby that he says is his, are still living together as husband and wife. My husband is now employed by the Illinois Central failroad as a lineman and receives approximately \$4,20.00 per month after all deductions are made. There was born to my husband and I

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
