TO THE HONORABLE F. W. HARE, JUDGE OF THE CIRCUIT COURT OF BALDWIN COUNTY, ALABAMA, IN CHANCERY SITTING:

## PART ONE

Your complainant, Lloyd A. Magney, respectfully shows to the Court that he is over the age of twenty-one years and a resident of Foley, in the County of Baldwin, in the State of Alabama; that the respondent, H. W. Bartling, is also over the age of twenty-one years and a non-resident of the State of Alabama, residing in the City of Chicago, County of Cook and State of Illinois, where his address is 39 South LaSalle Street; that the respondent, Lucile Serena Bartling, is also over the age of twenty-one years and a non-resident of the State of Alabama, residing at Chicago, in the County of Cook and State of Illinois, where her address is 7724 North Hoskins; that the respondent, Vera G. Bartling, is also over the age of twenty-one years and a non-resident of the State of Alabama and a resident of Chicago, in Cook County, in the State of Illi nois, where her address is 6960 North Hilldale Avenue; that the respondent, Rose Bartling, is also over the age of twenty-one years and a non-resident of the State of Alabama, and a resident of the City of Chicago, County of Cook and State of Illinois, where her address is 7724 North Hoskins; that the respondent, John H. Bach, is also over the age of twenty-one years and is a non-resident of the State of Alabama, and a resident of Northbrook, in the County of Cook, and State of Illinois, where his address is Dundee Road; that the respondent, Lillian M. Bach, is also over the age of twenty-one

years and a non-resident of the State of Alabama and a resident of Northbrook, in the County of Cook, in the State of Illinois, where her address is Dundee Road.

## PART TWO

Your complainant further avers and shows to the Court:

- 1. That on or about the 26th day of September, 1928, the respondents, John H. Bach and Lillian M. Bach, together with one Minnie M. Johnson, made, executed and delivered to one Otto Rudert, their negotiable promissory note in the face amount of TWELVE HUNDRED & 00/100 (\$1200.00) DOLLARS, due five (5) years after date, with interest at the rate of 7% per annum, from date until paid.
- 2. That on or about March 6th, 1929, the said Otto Rudert died, leaving a last will and testament, which said last will and testament was duly allowed for probate and record by the Courts of the State of Illinois, wherein the said Otto Rudert resided at the time of his death. That by said last will and testament one R. W. Olmsted was named executor and the said R. W. Olmsted was at all of the times hereinafter mentioned, and is now, the duly, appointed, qualified and acting executor of the will and estate of the said and as such the legal holder of and entitled Otto Rudert, deceased, to collect and enforce said note.
- 3. That on the 17th day of July, 1935, said note being then past due and unpaid, suit was instituted by the said R. W. Olmsted, executor as aforesaid, in the Circuit Court of Cook County, in the City of Chicago, and the State of Illinois, against the said John H. Bach and Lillian M. Bach, claiming upon said note aforesaid and summons was personally served out of said Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois, upon the said John H. Bach and Lillian M. Bach, whereby the said Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois, which is a Court record, obtained and had jurisdiction of the persons of the said John H. Bach and Lillian M. Bach, and of the subject matter of said suit.
- 4. That on the 6th day of September, 1935, in the City of Chicago, County of Cook, and State of Illinois, a judgment was en-

tered against the said John H. Bach and Lillian M. Bach, in said suit and upon said note aforesaid by Benjamin P. Epstein, Judge of said Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois, in the amount of FIFTEEN HUNDRED FIFTY & 50/100 (\$1550.50) DOLLARS.

- 5. That thereafter and on the 13th day of September, 1935, said judgment was, for a valuable consideration by the said R. W. Olmsted, executor as aforesaid, assigned and transferred to the complainant herein and the complainant is now the owner and holder of said judgment and entitled to collect thereon. That no part of said judgment has been paid and there is now due and owing to the complainant, from the respondents, John H. Bach and Lillian M. Bach, upon said judgment, the sum of FIFTEEN HUNDRED FIFTY & 50/100 (\$1550.50) DOLLARS, together with interest since said September 6th, 1935.
- 6. That suit has been commenced by the complainant herein against the respondents, John H. Bach and Lillian M. Bach, in the Circuit Court of Baldwin County, Alabama, law side, based upon said judgment of the Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois, hereinbefore described, which said suit is now pending.
- 7. That on or about the first day of August, 1933, shortly before the note aforesaid became due and payable, the said respondents, John H. Bach and Lillian M. Bach, made, executed and delivered to one Henry C. Bartling their mortgage deed in the amount of TWENTY FIVE HUNDRED & 00/100 (\$2500.00) DOLLARS, by which said mortgage deed they conveyed to the said Henry C. Bartling the following described real estate in Baldwin County, Alabama, to-wit:-

Lot twenty-four (24) and the east one-half  $(E_2^1)$  of lot twenty-three (23) in block eighteen (18) in the Town of Foley.

Said mortgage deed was dated August 1st, 1933, due in five (5) years from date, with interest at 6% per annum, and was recorded in the Office of the Judge of Probate in Baldwin County, Alabama, in Mortgage Book #57 at pages 183 to 185 thereof.

- The said real estate so conveyed by said mortgage was all of the real estate and substantially all of the property owned by the respondents, John H. Bach and Lillian M. Bach, and said mortgage, being for TWENTY FIVE HUNDRED & 00/100 (\$2500.00) DOLLARS, is more than the value of said real estate and if said mortgage be held to be a valid lien and charge upon said real estate the equity of the respondents, John H. Bach and Lillian M. Bach, therein is wholly destroyed thereby and said respondents are insolvent. But complainant avers that said mortgage deed was made and executed by the said respondents, John H. Bach and Lillian M. Bach, and accepted by the said Henry C. Bartling, as a part of a scheme and conspiracy on the part of said respondents and said Bartling to hinder and delay and defraud the creditors of the said respondents, and particularly the holder of the note hereinbefore described, and to prevent the collection of the indebtedness due from the said respondents; that the recited consideration of said mortgage, to-wit, the sum of TWENTY FIVE HUNDRED & 00/100 (\$2500.00) DOLLARS, was not paid by the said Bartling, was a simulated consideration and the said Bartling paid nothing to the respondents, nor to anyone for them, for said mortgage; that said mortgage was a voluntary conveyance from the said respondents to the said Bartling, made and accepted with the intent and express purpose of defrauding the creditors of the said respondents.
- 9. Your complainant further avers that he is informed and believes, and upon such information and belief charges the fact to be, that said mortgage was never delivered to the said Bartling with the intention of making the same a valid lien upon the said real estate but that the same was placed of record in Baldwin County, Alabama, and then returned to the said respondents, and at the same time a release of said mortgage was executed by the said Bartling and delivered to the said respondents, which said release they withhold from record, so as to make said mortgage appear to be a valid lien upon said real estate when in truth and in fact

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
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
