TO THE HONORABLE TELFAIR J. MASHBURN, JR., JUDGE OF THE CIRCUIT COURT OF BALDWIN COUNTY, ALABAMA, IN EQUITY:

And now comes your complainant, Edna M. Reynolds, and humbly complaining against Byron J. Reynolds, respondent, respectfully shows unto your Honor:

FIRST:

That your complainant and the said Byron J. Reynolds, are each over the age of twenty-one years, and are residents of Baldwin County, where they have resided for more than thirty years.

SECOND:

That your complainant and the said Byron J. Reynolds and husband and wife having intermarried at Albany, Ohio, March 1, 1910, that they lived together at Magnolia Springs, Alabama,

as husband and wife until respondent voluntarily abandoned this complainant more than twelve months ago without just cause or reasonable excuse and that they have not lived together since the said abandonment.

WHEREFORE your Complainant prays that this Honorable Court will take the jurisdiction of the cause made by this bill of complaint and make the said Byron J. Reynolds, party defendant hereto and by appropriate process require him to plead, answer or demur to the same within the time and under the pains and penalties prescribed by law and the practice of this Honorable Court.

Complainant further prays that upon the final hearing of this cause this Honorable Court will make and enter a decree forever dissolving the bonds of matrimony existing between this complainant and the said defendant, and complainant prays for such other, further or different relief as in equity and good conscience she shall be entitled to receive in the premises.
