I am 45 years old and my wife, Genevieve, is 33. We were married on November 12th
1949 at Pikeville, Kentucky. I am a barber. I took a job in Fairhope and we went
to live there right after our marriage and have been living there ever since. After
we were married, my wife, who had been married before, began to drink regularly,
sometimes for days on end. During the time just prior to our marriage she had not
done this. After we had been living in Fairhope for some months, most days when I
came home, she would be drunk. I could not go anywhere with her because she always
shamed me and herself by getting helplessly drunk. Many time, I had to carry her
bodily out to the car to get her home. She made life at home a misery. No meals,
slovenly personally and the house looked like a junk shop. I took it as long as I
could and then decided to quit a few weeks ago. She went to Ohio to her folks. We have
no children nor any property. I am still living in and employed in Fairhope.
