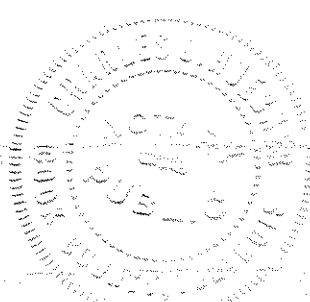

WIFE LIVING SEPARATE AND APART FROM BED AND BOARD OF
HUSBAND FOR TWO YEARS WITHOUT SUPPORT FROM HIM IN ACCORDANCE
WITH SECTION 22 of TITLE 34 of the 1940 CODE OF ALABAMA.

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that neither party to this suit shall again marry except to each other until sixty days after the rendition of this decree, and that if appeal is taken within sixty days, neither party shall again marry except to each other during the pendency of said appeal.

It is further ordered that the Complainant and Respondent be, and they are hereby permitted to again contract marriage upon the payment of the cost of this suit.

It is further ordered that MARIE L. GLEASON
the COMPLAINANT pay the cost herein to be taxed, for which execution may issue.
