It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that neither party to this suit shall again marry except to each other until sixty days after the rendition of this decree, and that if appeal is taken within sixty days, neither party shall again marry except to each other during the pendency of said appeal.

It is further ordered that the Complainant and Respondent be, and they are hereby permitted to again contract marriage upon the payment of the cost of this suit.

It is further ordered that Corbin Williams the Complainant pay the cost herein to be taxed, for which execution may issue.

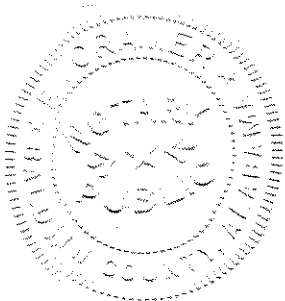

I am 40 years old and my wife is 41. We were married at Pensacola, Florida, on August 14th 1936. At that time, we were both residents of Baldwin County, Alabama, and have continued being residents ever since. On March 12th 1950, my wife quit me and has refused to resume our marriage relationship ever since. I believe that the main trouble was that I wanted a family and she did not. There was no physical reason why she should not have had children, particularly since she had been married previously and had a child by her previous husband. However, we have no children and there is no problem as regards property.
