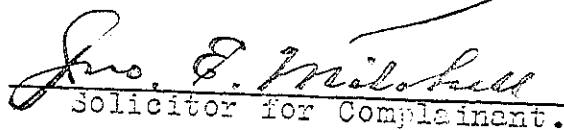

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

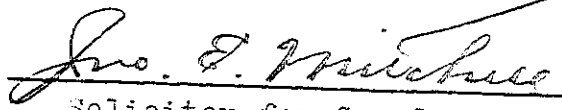
