Your Complainant, Willie Staimpel, respectfully shows unto the Court and your Honor as follows:

- 1. Your Complainant, Willie Staimpel, is over the age of twenty-one years and is a resident citizen of Baldwin County, Alabama; that the Respondent, Sue Trammel, is over the age of twenty-one years but her place of residence and Post Office address is unknown and it cannot be ascertained after reasonable effort in regard thereto.
- 2. That a marriage ceremony was performed between your Complainant and Respondent in Biloxi, Millissippi, during the month of November, 1956; that said marriage ceremony was performed under a mistake of fact existing in the mind of your Complainant and that the said marriage was and is void.
- 3. That the Respondent in this cause was already married to a man named Trammel at the time of the purported marriage between your Complainant and the Respondent, and that the said Respondent was not divorced at the time of the purported marriage. That during the month of December, 1956, and after your Complainant and Respondent had lived together as man and wife for approximately one month, your Complainant discovered that the Respondent was married and he and the said Respondent separated and have not lived together since December, 1956, as husband and wife.
- 4. Since Complainant has learned the true marital status of the Respondent, he does not desire to comsumate said marriage relation and it is his will and desire that said marriage should be anulled.

The premises considered your Complainant makes the said Sue Trammel a party Respondent to this Bill of Complaint and prays that service may be had upon her in the manner prescribed by law, and that she be required to plead, answer or demur to this Bill of Complaint within thirty days after such service, and that upon a final hearing hereof your Complainant prays that this Honorable Court will make and enter a decree adjudging and declaring the said marriage ceremony between your Complainant and the said Respondent to be null and void, and that the marriage relation does not exist between your Complainant and the said Respondent, Sue Trammel.

Your Complainant further prays that he may have such other, further or different relief as in equity he may be entitled.
