IT IS, THEREFORE, Ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Court, that the bonds of matrimony heretofore existing between the Complainant and Defendant be, and the same are hereby dissolved, and the said

as alleged in said Bill of Complaint;

It is further ordered, that the said George E Pierce be, and he is hereby permitted to again contract marriage, upon the payment of the costs of Court in this cause.

It is further ordered, that the said George E Pierce pay the costs herein taxed, for which execution may issue, and if such execution is returned "no property found," then execution for such costs may issue against the said

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that said George E Pierce shall not again marry except to said Sallie Pierce until sixty days after this date, and that if an appeal is taken within sixty days she shall not marry again except to said Sallie Pierce during the pendency of said appeal.
