It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that neither party to this suit shall again marry except to each other until sixty days after the rendition of this decree, and that if appeal is taken within sixty days, neither party shall again marry except to each other during the pendency of said appeal.

It is further ordered that the Complainant and Respondent be, and they are hereby permitted to again contract marriage upon payment of the cost of this suit.

It is further ordered that Complainant the pay the cost herein to be taxed, for which executed may issue.

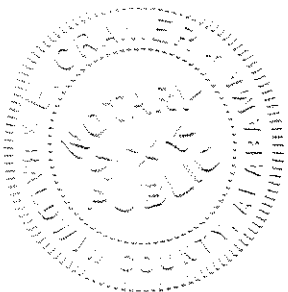

Comes SARAH C. PAIGE, and by this her bill of complaint presented against LESLIE J. PAIGE, respectfully shows:

FIRST: That Complainant and Defendant are both over the age of twenty-one years; that Complainant is now and has been for more than one year next preceding the filing of this bill of complaint, a bona fide resident of Belforest, Baldwin County, Alabama; but that Defendant is a non-resident of the State of Alabama, and his address is not known to this Complainant, and cannot be ascertained after reasonable effort.

SECOND: That Complainant and Respondent were lawfully married on or about the 1st day of November, 1927, in Monroeville, Alabama.

THIRD: Complainant further avers that the Respondent voluntarily abandoned the bed and board of Complainant for more than one year next preceding the filing of this bill of complaint since which time Complainant and Respondent have not lived together nor in any way recognized each other as husband and wife.

FOURTH: Complainant further avers that to this marriage there has been born six children and the following named are minors who are living with this Complainant and are, namely; Patricia Ann Paige, a daughter aged three years old; Evelyn Paige, a daughter aged six years old. Complainant further alleges that said minor children are residing with her and that she is a suitable person to have care and custody of said minor children.

THE PREMISES CONSIDERED, your Complainant prays that the said Leslie J. Paige be notified of the pendency of this bill by appropriate process and required to plead, answer or demur within the time required by law and that on a final hearing of this cause your Honor will enter a decree divorcing your Complainant from Respondent, granting your Complainant the right to re-marry should she so desire and granting Complainant the right to resume her maiden name and Your Honor will grant such other further or different relief as to Your Honor may seem just and proper.





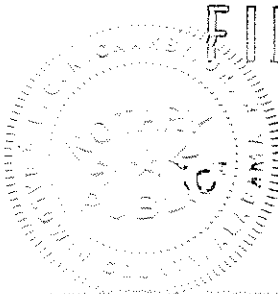

This cause having come on to be tried on the date hereinafter stated, and the Court after considering the pleadings herein and also the evidence presented, is of the opinion that the final assessment of mileage tax dated March 13, 1953 and made against the said G.
