PRAYER FOR PROCESS.

Complainant prays that, by the State's writ of subpoena or by process of publication, as may be appropriate, each of said respondents and all persons claiming under, such of them as, if any be made respondents to this bill of complaint and be commanded to demur to, plead to or answer this bill of complaint within the time allowed by law, and in default thereof that a decree pro-confesso be taken against them or any one or more of them so in default.

also owns an undivided one half interest in said lands; that the said George H. Swift are in actual possession of all of the other lands described in the bill of complaint; that the complainants and the said George H. Hoyle are desirous that the interest of the said Hoyle in all of said lands be segregated from that of the complainants and the said William H. Swift, and complainants aver that a fair and equitable division of said lands would be to set apart to the said Hoyle the 80 acres now actually possessed by him, and to set apart all other lands described in the bill of complaint to the complainants and the said William H. Swift. Complainants further aver that such partition would be to the interest of the minor complainants, as well as to the other parties to this cause, as the said George H. Complainants call upon each of the said respondents above named and each of said respondents described or referred to in this bill of complaint to show cause, if any they have, why the Judge of this Honorable Court should not take jurisdiction of this cause and make a division of the lands described in this bill of complaint between the complainants and respondents named in this bill of complaint so as to divest the said undivided interest or claim in and to the -----

of age attending the A. & M. College in the State of Mississippi, and Amelia A. Swift a minor over fourteen years of age and attending school at Tallahassee, Florida; all of said minors are residents of the State of Alabama and make their home with their mother, Susie P. Swift, at Bon Secour, Alabama.

SECOND.

The respondents are each over twenty-one years of age and the said George H. Hoyle resides at Battles Wharf, in the State of Alabama; that the residence and post office address of the said William H. Swift is unknown to complainants but when last heard of was in New Orleans, Louisiana; that complainants have made diligent search and inquiry to ascertain the residence and address of the said William H. Swift but have been unable to do so.

THIRD.

That the complainants and respondents are the joint owners of the real property in Baldwin County, State of Alabama, described as follows:

The Southeast ($SE\frac{1}{2}$) quarter; East ($E\frac{1}{2}$) half of Southwest ($SW\frac{1}{4}$) quarter; Northwest ($NW\frac{1}{4}$) quarter of Southwest ($SW\frac{1}{4}$) quarter and Southwest ($SW\frac{1}{2}$) quarter of Northwest ($NW\frac{1}{4}$) quarter of Section Seven (7), containing 320 acres, more or less;
