This cause coming on to be heard was submitted upon Bill of Complaint, ~~Decree Pro Confesso~~ on ~~Answer and Waiver~~ ----- and Testimony as noted by the Register, and upon consideration thereof, the Court is of the opinion that the Complainant is entitled to the relief prayed for in said bill.

It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Court that the bonds of matrimony heretofore existing between the Complainant and Defendant be, and the same are hereby dissolved, and that the said ~~Clara S. Jacobs~~ ----- is forever divorced from the said ~~George Jacobs~~ ----- for and on account of Cruelty

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that the complainant Clara S. Jacobs be and she is hereby awarded the permanent care, custody and control of the minor child born to the union of said parties, namely, Anthony John Jacobs; with the Respondent hereby being given the right to visit said child at reasonable times.

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that neither party to this suit shall again marry except to each other until sixty days after the rendition of this decree, and that if appeal is taken within sixty days, neither party shall again marry except to each other during the pendency of said appeal.

It is further ordered that the Complainant and Respondent be, and they are hereby permitted to again contract marriage upon payment of the cost of this suit.

It is further ordered that ~~George Jacobs~~ ----- the ~~Respondent~~ ----- pay the cost herein to be taxed, for which executed may issue.

My name is Clara S. Jacobs. I am over twenty-one years old and a resident of Baldwin County, Alabama, and have so resided for more than the past two years. That the respondent, George Jacobs, is over twenty-one years old and resides in Baldwin County, Alabama. He was married on February 13, 1946, in Kibler, Alabama. On about December 22nd and many times before that George struck and hit me and he has committed other acts of violence on me that endangered my life and health. He has made threats too numerous to count of doing me physical harm and judging from his attitude and conduct toward me, I am reasonably convinced that if I continued to live with him, he will commit acts upon my person which will endanger my life and health. The last of these acts occurred on about December 22, 1954, and since that time he have not lived together as husband and wife. He had one child, a boy, Anthony J. Jacobs, now about six years old. The said child is now in my care, custody and control; further that I am a fit and proper person to be awarded the permanent care, custody and control of said minor child, Anthony J. Jacobs.

My name is Mrs. Fred Volker. I am over twenty-one years old, live in Baldwin County, and for many years have known Clara S. Jacobs and George Jacobs. They are both over twenty-one years old and live in Daphne, Alabama. They were married the first part of February, 1946, in Kibler, Alabama. I have been familiar for the past couple of years with the manner in which George has treated Clara; he has struck her on numerous occasions and made threats of going bodily hard to her which would necessarily endanger her life and health; I believe that if they continue to live together George will endanger her life and health. I believe the last of these threats occurred just before Christmas of 1954, and since then George and Clara have not been living together. They had one child, a boy, Anthony John Jacobs, now about six years old; the child is now living with the mother, and she is a fit and proper person to have the permanent care of minor child, Anthony John Jacobs.

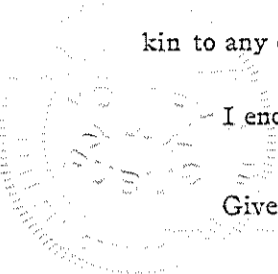

Comes now the Respondent, George Jacobs, and for answer to the Bill of Complaint heretofore filed against him in said cause, says as follows:

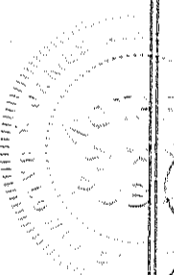
1. That he denies each and every allegation of the said Bill of Complaint and demands strict proof thereof.

Comes now the Complainant, CLARA S. JACOBS, humbly complaining of the Respondent, GEORGE JACOBS, in a matter of divorce, and represents and shows unto Your Honor as follows:

FIRST: That Complainant, CLARA S. JACOBS, is over the age of twenty-one years and is a resident of Baldwin County, Alabama, and has been a bona fide resident of said State for more than two years next preceding the filing of this Bill of Complaint; that respondent is over 21 years and lives in Daphne, Alabama.

SECOND: That your complainant and respondent were lawfully married on or about, to-wit: February 12, 1948, at Mobile, Alabama.

THIRD: Your complainant avers and charges that the said respondent did on or about the 22nd day of December, 1954, and many times subsequent thereto assault, beat, hit and strike complainant; that said respondent has committed actual violence on her person attended with danger to her health or life; complainant avers and charges that respondent has made numerous threats of doing her physical harm and from his manner and conduct toward her, she is reasonably convinced that he will commit an actual violence upon her person, attended with danger to her life or health; that the last of said assaults and threats did occur on about the 22nd day of December, 1954, since which said time complainant and respondent have not lived together as husband and wife.

FOURTH: Complainant further avers that there was born of the union of the complainant and respondent one child, a boy, Anthony John Jacobs, now about six years old. That said child is now in the care, custody, and control of its mother, the complainant. Further that complainant is a fit and proper person to

be awarded the care, custody, and control of the said minor child, Anthony John Jacobs.

PRAYER FOR PROCESE

Wherefore the premises considered the complainant prays that the said George Jacobs be made party respondent to this her Bill of Complaint and that a summons be issued and served upon him as required by law and the rules of this Honorable Court, and that he be required to plead, answer or demur to the within Bill of Complaint within the time and under the penalties prescribed by law and the rules of this Honorable Court.

PRAYER FOR FINAL RELIEF


