

Comes DICK WESTON and respectfully shows unto your Honor:

FIRST: That he and the defendant are both over the age of twenty-one years, and are now, and have been for more than three years prior to this date, residents of the County of Baldwin and State of Alabama; that they were lawfully married in Baldwin County more than three years ago, and up to February 3rd, 1915, lived together as man and wife, near Little River, Ala.

SECOND: That on February 3rd, 1915, the said Samilla Weston, without lawful reason or good excuse, voluntarily abandoned the bed and board of complainant and has, since that time, lived, separate and apart from him, in Baldwin County, though at no great distance, and that since said separation they have not at any time resumed marital relations.

THIRD: Wherefore complainant prays that your Honor take jurisdiction of this cause, that Camilla Weston be made a party hereto, and be, by appropriate process, required to answer this bill. That it may please your Honor upon the hearing of the cause, to decree that the bonds of matrimony existing between complainant and defendant, be dissolved; that he be permitted to marry again, and have such other, further, or different relief as to Equity as may seem meet.
