

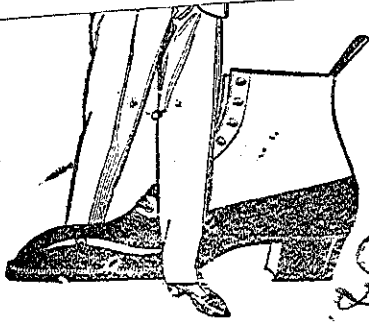

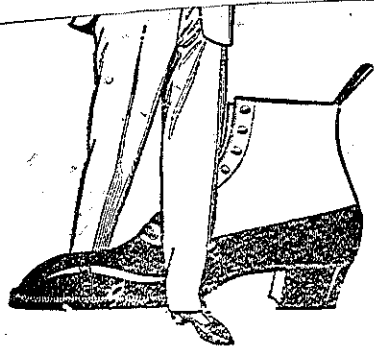

Before me Frank S Stone a Notary Public in and for said state and county personally appeared Salan Kahally, who is known to me and who being by me duly sworn doth depose and say under oath that he is the complainant in the above cause; that when he made affidavit for publication against Sadie Kahally, she was then a non resident of the State of Alabama, and that she was then in New York City, but at what address affiant did not know, that before he made said affidavit he had written to Sadie Kahally to come home but she had refused, that after she had refused to return and live with affiant he started suit for divorce and made said affidavit and at the time of making said affidavit he had no knowledge of her street address or number.

That affiant and Sadie Kahally have two young boys, aged 11 and 12 years respectively, that affiant had placed said boys in Birmingham at school and that Sadie Kahally when she left Bay Minette Alabama, stated that she was going to visit the boys, but left Birmingham a few days after and went to New York and wrote to affiant that a man had sent her a ticket, when Sadie Kahally left Bay Minette she told affiant that she would not come back.

Further deposing affiant says under oath that he is even now willing to take her back on account of the two boys who need her care and attention, and that he has repeatedly offered since the rendition of the decree of divorce to remarry her and live with her if she would do right but she has as repeatedly refused to do so, stating to affiant that "if she be good it would be for some other man and not affiant" also that she has informed affiant that she would not remarry him unless he give her a deed to his residence in Bay Minette and an interest in his mercantile business. And petitioner further alleges that at the time said telegrams were sent, that Salen Kahalley knew that your petitioner was endeavoring to secure means of transportation, so that she could return to her home and to her husband, and he further knew that she might get said means from the said Kotite, and that said telegrams were sent for the purpose of preventing her from getting home, so that he might secure this divorce without her having an opportunity of contesting same.

THIRD: Petitioner further alleges that the allegations in the said bill that she was guilty of adultery were and are all untrue, and that she has a good and meritorious defense to said allegations.

To the Honorable A. E. Gamble, Judge of the Second Judicial Circuit, sitting in Equity at Baldwin County, Alabama:

Your petitioner, Sadie Kahalley, respectfully represents unto your honor as follows:

FIRST: That Salen Kahalley filed a bill of complaint in this Honorable Court on or about November 8, 1917, naming your petitioner as respondent, and in which bill he prayed for a divorce from her on the grounds of adultery, and falsely made an affidavit that your petitioner was a non-resident of Alabama, and sought to secure service on her by publication; that a decree pro confesso was rendered upon such service by publication, and that said cause was submitted for final decree and such final decree granting the prayer of the bill was rendered on the 9th day of February, 1918.

SECOND: Your petitioner alleges that although the said Salen Kahalley knew her proper address in New York, that he never alleged or gave it, and that she never received notice or knew that such a bill of complaint had been filed against her or that the said Salen Kahalley was trying to get a divorce from her, and that she did not know anything of such proceedings until within the last few days; that she was not a non-resident of the State of Alabama at the time of the filing of said bill of complaint, or at the time of the making of the affidavit that she was such non-resident, and this fact was then known to the said Salen Kahalley, but notwithstanding such knowledge, he falsely made said affidavit; that the said Salen Kahalley furnished the money and sent her first to Birmingham, Alabama, where their children then were, and then to New York, for medical treatment, and that he knew her proper address and how to reach her during all of the period that she spent in New York, and that just a day or two prior to the filing of said bill of complaint and making of said affidavit of her being a non-resident, the said Salen
