

My name is Colene Mauldin. I am over the age of eighteen years. I am a bona fide resident of Foley, Baldwin County, Alabama and have been a bona fide resident of Alabama all of my life.

I married Jake R. Maulden at Pascagoula Mississippi on July 11, 1952.

Jake and I have never lived together since the day we were married. I came back and lived with my folks and he lived with his in Roberdsdale. He voluntarily abandoned me right after we were married and we have not lived together or in anyway recognized each as husband and wife since that time. That was more than a year ago before I filed this bill for divorce. I have worked and supported myself every since we were married.

My name is Mattie Grantham. I am over eighteen years of age and Colene Mauldin is my sister. She married Jake Maulden in Pascagoula Miss., some time shortly after the Fourth of July, 1952. Colene has always lived with our folks and continued to live with them after she was married to Jake. She has never lived with him since they were married to my knowledge. Colene has worked and supported herself ever since she and Jake got married. As for any support given Colene by Jake, he has never given her anything to my knowledge.
