The testimony is to the effect that the Complainant is a mature woman with a monthly income of not less than \$71.19; that she is in good physical condition, and has relatives and friends with whom she spends practically all of her time; that the Respondent is a man in his middle sixties; that he is sick and has been under the care of a Physician since 1951, and that it is necessary that he take medicine all of the time; that he hs indebted to his Physician in the sum of \$914.00, and in addition thereto, his Doctor and Medical bill amount to approximately \$25.00 a month; that his necessary expenses total approximately \$190.00 per month; that he is at present on probation at Brookley Field to determine whether or not his physical condition will be such that he can continue to work; that his income is approximately \$120.00 each two weeks; that his physical condition, in the opinion of his Physician, is such that it will probably not get any better.

That the condition of the Respondent was known to the Complainant at the time they married.

The Court is, therefore, of the opinion and to the conclusion, having had the opportunity to see and hear the respective parties and their witnesses, that the Complainant is not entitled to the relief prayed for.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the bill of complaint on behalf of the Complainant be, and the same is hereby dismissed.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED by the Court that the Complainant pay the cost herein taxed, for which execution may issue.
